Hello Hanlon Families,

On Tuesday, we gathered for our first monthly All School Meeting (ASM) in the Hanlon gymnasium. It was so special to see the entire student body and faculty gathered in one room! The vision for ASM is to bring our school together as a community on a regular basis, and celebrate what is happening in and around classrooms. This year, we kicked off our ASM by reading the book *If You Plant a Seed* by Kadir Nelson. The story was used to set the theme of our school year: Planting seeds of kindness will cause kind behaviors to “grow and grow” within our school. As adults, many of us tell our children, “If you can’t say something nice, don’t say it at all.” At our ASM, we challenged students by saying, “If you can’t say something nice, think harder.” This theme of spreading kindness will be woven throughout our school all year long.

On Wednesday, we practiced our first fire drill. Students were well prepared by their teachers, and the entire building was safely evacuated in under four minutes. We will practice fire drills and lockdown drills several times this year.

Thank you to the parents who were able to attend the Welcome Principal’s Coffee. I got lots of great ideas for future Coffee topics. If you were unable to attend but would like to suggest a topic, please email me with your idea.

The warm weather has encouraged many families to bring their dogs along on the walk to school. While many students love dogs, there are an equal number of children who are fearful. Please remember that dogs should always be leashed, kept on the parking lot side of the fence, and closely supervised by adults.

Please remember to update your emergency contact information in the district’s Aspen database. Aspen is available on the District Website. At this point about half of Hanlon families have updated their information, and we need 100% to ensure that our

PTO directory is current, and that our main office has the most current emergency information. Parents of new students and kindergarten families should pay special attention to the Media Permissions question. In order for students to have their photos in classrooms, on slideshows, on the website, etc., we need the Media Permissions to say "yes." Hello Hanlon Families,

It's been a busy couple of weeks here at Hanlon!

Now that students are back in the routines of the school year, it is remarkable to see the hard work they are doing. I try to get into classrooms every day. Some days, I can spend time in every classroom, other days I am able to make it to a few. This week, I took note of writing in particular. In kindergarten classrooms, September writing often consists of drawing pictures and labeling words and sounds. Children 'read' their stories by telling what was happening in each picture. By second grade, students were writing across multiple pages. When they finished one story, they immediately

began another. Fourth graders were working on adding sensory details. I read stories that described the smell of cinnamon in a donut shop and the glint of wrapping paper under a holiday tree. The fifth graders were using poetic techniques to draft three poems, revise and edit, and then type their final draft poems using Google Docs. It is quite impressive to see the rigor present in Hanlon classrooms and the output of our students. And it's only September!

Thank you to the following parents who volunteered their time to help out with Picture Day this Tuesday: Mary Beauregard, Ted Brown, Stephanie Finegold, and Amy Meredith. They helped to keep the lines moving, entertained students who were waiting, and made sure that every student looked his or her best.

This week, teachers in grades K-2 across the district will attend training for the Foundations program. Based on Wilson Reading System principles, Foundations builds a foundation for reading and spelling in the younger grades. Many teachers have already begun using Foundations in their classrooms. My own children used Foundations both in Newton and now in Franklin, and I have been impressed with the gains they have made in reading.

I am thrilled to announce that Valerie Sharpe, first grade teacher, welcomed twin girls on Friday. Eleanor, Audrey, and mom are all doing well! Maureen Reynolds, long-term substitute teacher, has led the class with great skill, confidence, and ease. The first graders will thrive under her leadership. We look forward to welcoming Ms. Sharpe back in late January.

Our wonderful lunchroom aide, Ms. Jahn, is leaving Hanlon in two weeks. The students, teachers, and I will miss her warm smile, patience, and overall kindness. We have been fortunate to have her.
