## Tech Tidbits from Mr. Goguen

IXL (from "I excel") is a practice website for math, language arts, science and social studies. The Westwood Public Schools subscribe to the Math content for our K-5 elementary students. Login information can be found <u>here</u>.

IXL is organized by grade level and provides limitless, dynamically created questions in hundreds of skill areas. As a result, when a child first signs on it can be overwhelming to understand where to begin. In some cases, teachers will assign skills by identifying a letter and a number (i.e. F<sub>5</sub>).

Although IXL can be a fabulous tool for practicing and reinforcing math skills, there are a few important considerations to keep in mind. A bad habit of solving all the math mentally could develop. Remind your child that using scrap paper or a whiteboard is a more accurate strategy in many situations. Likewise, when a student incorrectly answers a question s/he is presented with "Sorry, incorrect ..." Another poor habit is to quickly press "Got it." Instead, remind your child to review the correct answer and the explanation. Our youngest students will absolutely need support with this concept, so expecting IXL to be an independent task might be missing an opportunity to reinforce good strategies and metacognition. ~ Previous Tech Tidbits

#### **Science Update**

This year WPS has begun a three-year process of alignment with the new MA Curriculum Frameworks for Science and Technology/Engineering that were adopted in January. After a great deal of research, we have chosen to use STEMscopes, a science curriculum that is specifically aligned with the MA Standards. This program emphasizes inquiry and exploration, hands-on, project-based learning, and offers engineering design challenges that encourage student collaboration.

If you were to walk into one of Hanlon's classrooms, you would see students DOing science, not just reading about it (although connections to nonfiction literature are embedded throughout). For example, children might explore amplitude and wavelength by shaking and moving long coils of steel, experiment with the ratio of the height of a ramp to the speed and distance that a Matchbox car will travel, or developing a

deep understanding of what matter is by debating whether clouds, fire, and wind are matter, or something else.

Under the guidance of our new Science Coordinator, Kate Doyle, and our Leadership Team, teachers have already begun professional development to deepen their content knowledge, experience the investigations that students will participate in, and to begin planning their lessons to meet the needs of their students. Ms. Kelly, Ms. Feuer-Beck, Ms. Lindsay, and myself are all part of the district-wide Science Leadership Team. #### **Bus Safety**

On Tuesday, School Resource Officer Pindel visited Hanlon to review bus safety rules with all students. He reminded them about the following rules:

- Bus Stops: be on time, pay attention to cars, and avoid games that involve running, throwing, and catching as they take your focus off the road
- Bus Seats: remain seated with your backpack on your lap and your hands away from windows
- Crossing: even if you see someone else looking left and right, you should still look both ways before crossing

Officer Pindel also led students in a Bus Evacuation Drill in which students identified the emergency exits (back, windows, ceiling, main door) and practiced hopping safely out the back door. This annual Safety Lesson prepares all students for riding the bus on field trips and other events.

#### A Message from the School Nurse, Ms. Davie

Just a reminder that state mandated annual screenings are taking place. Vision screening takes place for all students, hearing screening for students in K-3rd grade and BMI screening in 1st and 4th grade. You will only be notified if your child has difficulties with the screenings. Please call if you have any questions or concerns about your children.

#### Tech Tidbit from Mr. Goguen

What types of devices are used at each grade level?

- Each K 1 classroom has 6 iPads capable of running the latest iOS 10 update from Apple.
   Teachers typically use these iPads as a station. Learning how to properly insert and remove headphones can be quite a challenge. As a result, we have had a few broken pins stuck in the jack.
   Likewise, controlling the audio volume is another hurdle for our youngest students.
- Second graders transition to computers so each classroom has 4 Mac desktops that can be used as
  a station. Teachers also have access to Macbook carts so they can get more kids on at one time. A
  few challenges for second graders include getting familiar with the keyboard, scrolling, click and
  dragging and learning to control the mouse and cursor.
- Our grade 3 5 classrooms also have a bank of Mac desktops but technology use is more likely to be whole class directed with students using Macbooks or Chromebooks. The Chromebook has become the machine of choice with our older students who can sign in with their Westwood Google account.
- A set of iPads is also available to borrow from the library. Teachers might use these for a special project or as a station.
- Specialist teaches also have access to the shared iPads and the laptops if it fits with their lesson design.
