Dear Hanlon Families,

I hope this email finds you well. I am thinking of you and those close to you during this unprecedented time. On behalf of the Hanlon staff, I want you to know that **we miss you all** and hope you are all staying safe and healthy. We will continue to work together as a community to remain connected and get through this closure. Below you will find a link to a letter from the Superintendent. It explains what learning and communication will look like over the next two weeks. Please read it carefully, and reach out to me or your child's teacher if you have any questions.

We understand these are uncertain and perhaps worrisome times and we want you to know that we are thinking of you all. The physical and social-emotional well-being of the children is our utmost priority. Try to focus on the things that you can do right now vs. the things that you cannot. We hope you're all able to take advantage of the time together and perhaps new opportunities because of this extra time: play outside, explore what nature has to offer, read, exercise, play board games, create, relax, cook/bake, listen to music, work on puzzles, choreograph a dance, and so on! The children are all so talented and creative - we can't wait to hear what they did!

At the same time, I want to reiterate the message that our students and families have heard many times: <u>it's critical that each one of us do their part to slow the spread of COVID-19 by limiting - or eliminating altogether - social interactions.</u> As inconvenient as it may be, please encourage your child to take seriously their role in keeping the most vulnerable members of our community healthy by not risking being exposed to COVID-19 in their social circles, among their teammates, their neighbors, etc.

Finally, I want to share my deep appreciation for my colleagues, from Superintendent Parks to our dedicated custodial staff, who have been working countless hours in the past two weeks to keep your child(ren) and the staff healthy and safe.

The past two weeks have presented each of us with unprecedented challenges. Thank you for your patience as we simultaneously focus on everyone's physical and mental health while meeting the need for students to stay engaged in learning. We are hopeful our plan around distance learning will accomplish that goal.

I consider it a great privilege to serve a community that, through this period of uncertainty, has demonstrated a deep commitment both to learning and to one another. I look forward to keeping you updated as we continue to balance those needs.
