- Post-COVID, there has been a significant statewide decrease in student daily attendance, and a significant increase in chronic absenteeism
 - Chronic absenteeism is defined as missing 10% or more of school, or 18 days over the course of a school year
 - Identified as a priority issue by DESE and the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education






2022 - 2023 Chronic Absenteeism - All Grades
