Dear Hanlon Families,

Yesterday, teachers across the district took part in professional development. We built upon work we did a few weeks ago using the <u>Dignity Framework by Donna Hicks</u>, an associate at Harvard Law School's Weatherhead Center for International Affairs. Dr. Hicks developed a new conflict resolution framework, one that focuses on the concept of human dignity, after nearly two decades of helping communities in conflict resolve their differences. Given Tuesday's election and the political climate across the nation, I wanted to share some resources with families in case you are looking for literature, language, or help discussing the election or other difficult conversations. Here is a Padlet focused on <u>Dignity</u> and another focused on the <u>Presidential Election</u>. These resources were compiled by our District Coordinator for Literacy and Social Studies, Marcia Uretsky. I hope you find them useful!
