RE: Portrait of a Westwood Graduate

At our November School Committee meeting, I presented a <u>draft version of our Portrait of a Westwood Graduate</u>, which was developed in the fall by a working group representing a broad cross-section of community stakeholders, who were supported by our contract with Dore + Whittier and their educational consultant, MLP Integrated Design. Following that meeting, we engaged in a process of gathering feedback through surveys to staff and community members, as well as two live listening sessions. I want to thank all those who provided their thoughts on our draft, as we want to ensure that our Portrait of a Westwood Graduate is reflective of our values as a community.

In December, our working group was reconvened to analyze the feedback we received in order to make adjustments to our initial draft. Finally, a smaller subgroup of the working group met twice in late December and mid-January to produce our final content, shared below:

Graduates of the Westwood Public Schools will:

Think Critically and Creatively

Critical and innovative thinkers possess the skills, knowledge, and strategies to be curious, continuous learners. They understand information, develop content mastery, solve problems, adapt to novel situations, and design their own paths.

- Analyze, evaluate, and synthesize multiple perspectives and viewpoints
- Reflect, ask questions, and use reasoning and evidence to problem-solve
- Seek knowledge and apply understanding to adapt to novel situations

Communicate and Collaborate

Collaborative communicators connect effectively across identities, cultures, and generations. They leverage their skills and voices to be productive speakers, listeners, writers, creators, and contributors.

- Listen actively with purpose of understanding before making decisions
- Navigate interactions to work effectively with a variety of individuals and audiences
- Communicate and contribute respectfully through various modalities and platforms

Act with Integrity

Individuals with integrity are guided by a deep sense of self and compassion for others. They demonstrate authenticity, responsibility, and empathy in their decision-making and actions.

- Demonstrate courage to make positive choices even in difficult situations
- Model integrity and honesty in their words, actions, and work
- Adapt to and employ technology ethically and responsibly

Engage Locally and Globally

Engaged learners connect with local, national, and global communities to be a force for positive change. They find purpose and joy in service to one another and our world, and in improving conditions for all.

- Persevere in the face of challenges to be a force for positive change.

To finalize our Portrait of a Graduate, the next phase involves creating a graphic representation of our work to help as a communication tool for students, families, and the community. During our last working group session, we examined different graphic models from other districts and generated some initial ideas on how our design could best represent Westwood. In reflecting on that meeting (and all of our working group meetings), the contributions of our students were incredibly impactful and we knew we needed to look for an opportunity to bring more student voice into the design process.

I am happy to share that we will be holding a half-day design workshop, led by Dore + Whittier, in which students will go through the design process with an expert in the field, generating concepts which will then be used by our design team to develop a finished product. We are really excited about this opportunity to engage our students in this authentic work, not only for the experiences that they will have in the process, but also for how it will help make our finished product as strong as possible.

While the graphic work is underway, we will be able to simultaneously begin our strategic planning process this spring, which will be driven by our desire to meet our outcomes for students that are defined by our Portrait of a Graduate. I am excited to begin our strategic planning, and look forward to discussing our rollout of the process with the Committee at our meeting in March.

It was truly a pleasure to work with so many people from across our community that are dedicated to ensuring great outcomes for our students in Westwood, and I hope that they will continue to be involved in our future endeavors.
