Kindergarten

Foundational Skills of Reading

- o Retells familiar stories, including key details.
- Demonstrates an understanding of the organization and basic features of print.

Grade 1

Reading Literature & Informational Text

- Asks and answers questions about key details in a text.
- o Retells stories and determines central message.
- o Recognizes and uses features of text to locate information.
- o Applies grade level phonics and word analysis skills in decoding words.
- o Reads grade level text with accuracy and fluency to support comprehension.

Writing

- Writes narratives with 2 or more sequenced events, some details, words to signal event order, and a sense of closure.
- Writes informative texts that names a topic, supplies facts, and provides a sense of closure.
- Writes pieces that introduces a topic, states an opinion with a reason, and provides a sense of closure.
- Writes a complete sentence with appropriate capitalization and punctuation.

Language

- o Applies proper use of grammar and parts of speech when writing and speaking.
- Spells high-frequency words and common spelling patterns correctly.
- Acquires and uses new vocabulary when reading, writing and speaking.

Grade 2

Reading Literature & Informational Text

- Asks and answers questions to demonstrate understanding of key details in text (who, what, where, when, why, how).
- o Retells stories and determines central message or moral.
- Understands and uses various text features to locate key information.
- o Applies grade level phonics and word analysis skills in decoding words.
- o Reads grade level texts with accuracy and fluency to support comprehension.

Writing

- Writes narratives recounting an event including details, transitional words, dialogue, and a sense of closure.
- Writes informative texts with an introduction, facts and definitions to develop points, and a conclusion Writes opinion pieces with an introduction, supporting reasons, and a concluding statement.
- Strengthens writing by editing and revising.

Language

- Applies proper use of grammar, parts of speech, and conventions when writing and speaking.
- Spells high-frequency words and taught spelling patterns correctly in daily work.
- o Determines and clarifies the meaning of unknown words based on reading and content.

Grade 3

Reading Literature & Informational Text

- Applies grade level phonics and word analysis skills to decode and determine the meanings of unfamiliar words.
- Reads grade level texts with accuracy, pacing and expression.
- Determines the main idea and supporting details in informational text.

- Writes opinion pieces on topics or texts, supporting a point of view with relevant reasons.
- Writes informative texts to examine a topic and convey ideas and information clearly.
- Writes narratives to develop real or imagined experiences, logically ordered, using descriptions of actions, thoughts, and feelings.
- o Develops and strengthens writing by planning, revising and editing.

- Uses knowledge of standard English grammar and conventions when writing and speaking.
- Spells high-frequency words and taught spelling patterns correctly in daily work.

- Uses the writing process (draft, revise, and edit) to produce clear writing.
