



REGISTRATION FOR THE WESTWOOD LITTLE LEAGUE SPRING 2018 SEASON IS NOW OPEN!

Who: For Westwood Boys and Girls in Kindergarten through 6th grade

What: 2018 Spring Registration for Westwood Little League

Where: www.westwoodlittleleague.com

When: Registration is now open! Early-bird registration in effect until January 31, 2018

Registration for each player covers hat & jersey, games & practices, and additional free indoor & outdoor clinics starting on Saturdays in February / March.

KBALL: Composed of both boys and girls in kindergarten, the entire focus is development. Kids are taught the basics of proper fielding & throwing mechanics, & they learn to hit by hitting off a tee. Games are typically 3-innings where each team bats once through the line-up each inning.

ROOKIE BALL: This division is composed of 1st graders. Coaches pitch to batters and each team bats continuously through the lineup. All players are positioned and play on defense. The kids play games, but 100% of the focus is on player development. Games typically begin in late-April and run through mid-June. All games are played at Hanlon School Field and are held Monday - Friday 5:45PM start times and some games on weekends.

INSTRUCTIONAL LEAGUE: This division is composed of 2nd graders. The emphasis at this level is on player development and sportsmanship. This is the first year of kids learning to pitch to each other. The goal is to ensure kids are learning proper skills and mechanics. Games typically begin in late-April and run through mid-June. All games are played at Downey School Field and are held Monday - Friday 5:45PM start times and occasionally on weekends.

INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE: This division is composed of 3rd graders. The emphasis at this level is on player development and sportsmanship. Games typically begin in mid-April and run through mid-June. Games are played at Martha Jones School Fields and are held Monday - Friday 5:45PM start times and occasionally on weekends.

MINOR LEAGUE: The Minor League Division is composed of 4th, 5th, & 6th graders. Focus is on teaching & learning baseball skills along with good sportsmanship in a competitive game scenario. Games typically begin in mid-April and run through mid-June. Most games are played at Sheehan School Fields and are held Monday - Friday 5:45p start times and on weekends. Some games played at Morrison Park will have a different start time.

MAJOR LEAGUE: The Major League is composed of 5th and 6th graders, primarily. By Little League International rules all 12 year olds (born May 2005 – Aug 2006) must play in the Majors. The balance of the league is comprised of 11 year olds and occasionally some 10 year olds that have already played a year in Minors. Every player plays at least 3 innings per game. Games typically begin in mid-April and run through mid-June. All games are played at Morrison Field and are held Monday - Friday 5:30p and 7:00p start times and weekends.


