Learning Center

*Provides academic support based on IEP

*Includes:

preview/review

study-skills

long-term project support

executive functioning

direct instruction in math, reading comprehension
and/or written expression

*Service delivery looks like: 8x40, 4x40

Small Group Classes

- *Modified curriculum

(key concepts, slower pace, repetition, language support)

- *Math co-taught by Special Educator and Math Teacher

- *ELA taught by Special Educator + IA(s)

- *Low student to staff ratio (approximately 1:3)

- *Service grid looks like 8x40

TLC Program

“Therapeutic Learning Center”

*Multi-grade program supporting students with social/emotional and behavioral needs

*Supported by an Adjustment Counselor, School-based Psychologist and additional related services as needed.

*Consult support from school based psychologist and a child Psychiatrist

*Services look like: 8x40 Learning Center + in-class support, and/or access to small group ELA/Math

SLC Program

“Social Learning Center”

*Multi-grade program supporting students with challenges in social/pragmatic language, executive functioning, and/or coping skills.

*Program support through a BCBA, OT, SLP, Adjustment Counselor and other related services as needed

*On-going program consultation by Aspire/MGH and Behavior Specialist

*Services look like: 8x40 Learning Center, 1-2x40 Social/Pragmatic class, in class support for all general education classes as needed, and/or access to small group ELA/Math

CLC Program

“Communication Learning Center”

- *Multi-grade program supporting students with challenges with communication, social, pragmatic language skills
- *Program support through a BCBA, OT, SLP and other related services as needed
- *Program consultation by Aspire/MGH and Behavior Specialist
- *Services look like: 8x40 Learning Center, 8x40 Communication class, small group ELA/Math/Sci/SS and in class support for inclusion opportunities

DLC Program

“Developmental Learning Center”

- *Multi-grade program supporting students with multiple, unique, complex developmental needs/disabilities
- *Can access to functional and community-based curriculum, curriculum individualized to each student, augmentative communication and technology infused throughout the day.
- *Program support through SLP, BCBA, OT, PT, Music Therapist, APE and other related services as needed.
- *Access to reverse inclusion/peer mentoring programs
- *Many students require wrap-around case management by liaison

Other Special Education supports

***Reading services** are provided by a licensed reading specialist (8x40 or 4x40)

***Technology** including: laptops, iPads and Chromebooks are available with a wide range of software and applications. Technology is also available in general education settings

***Assistive Technology** consult and Professional Development is available

***Mental Health Team** approach consisting of a school psychologist, adjustment counselor and guidance counselors

Landmark Outreach

- *On-going professional development from Landmark Consulting Co.

- *Integration of Landmark language-based/learning disabled strategies, feedback, lesson planning and teaching practices

- *Targeted to Special Education teachers, General Education teachers (Sci/SS) who serve students receiving small group ELA/Math, and ELA department

Transition 5-6

- *Middle school staff joins elementary spring IEP or transition meetings
- *Parents are welcome to visit and tour the middle school
- *Middle school staff may observe students
- *Comprehensive information sharing between service providers and educators
- *Extended School Year and Summer Enrichment occurs at TMS
- *Regular Education move-up days, parent meetings, overviews, occur throughout the spring
- *Individual transition plans developed, as needed

Transition 8-9

- *High school staff joins middle school IEP meetings
- *Parents are welcome to visit and tour the high school
- *High school staff may observe students
- *Comprehensive information sharing between service providers and educators
- *Extended School Year occurs at WHS
- *Regular Education move-up days, parent meetings, overviews, occur throughout the spring
- *Individual transition plans developed as needed
