News from 5B (Mr. Bartlett)

King Robert of England visited 5B last week and reigned down tyranny on his loyal (or not so loyal) colonists from Boston. In order to help pay for the French and Indian Wars, and to keep the peace with the natives, King Robert decided to raise taxes and enact a series of Proclamations and Acts in the classroom.

Some of these included:

- Proclamation of 1763 All 5th grade royal subjects must stay off the field at recess and sit at the front of the bus on the way home.
- **Sugar Act of 1764** Any item being consumed by royal subjects in the classroom that contains added sugar is subject to a five cent tax per item.
- **Stamp Act of 1765** All paper goods used in class will be taxed at two cents a sheet. All paper including homework, scrap paper and journal sheets will be subject to a five cent tax.
- Quartering Act of 1765 Subjects of the king must provide housing, shelter, seating, and food to any teacher that enters the classroom. Your space is now their space! Your food is their food!



• **The Tea Act of 1773** - All drinks consumed in class are only to be purchased from the King. No tea, water, juice may be consumed that is not sold by the king.

This simulation lasted less than one hour before the students were ready to revolt! Notes were secretly passed around with plans to overthrow of the king, and smuggling of goods was rampant!

Overall, this simulation was a lot of fun but it also helped students better understand the feelings of many colonists in the lead up to the Revolutionary War.

News from Drama (Mrs. Goldman)

We have begun our Drama curriculum in the 5th grade. Grade 5 Drama is designed to educate students about theatre.Students will learn basic acting techniques and theatre terminology. Drama will teach students how to work together as a group, think critically, use their imagination, discover new ideas, and problem solve. Students will learn how to improve their focus, self-confidence, and social skills. Everyone is expected to work to the best of their ability to achieve great success.



Our first Drama unit focused on team building and improvisation. We discussed the importance of being a great team member on and off stage and participated in several trust building activities. We learned that by building trust, we were able to


take healthy risks when improvising.

When I heard these words, it made me proud. MLK, Jr. made a big difference. Instead of using hate, he used love. By using love, he changed the laws.






News from Mathematics Specialist (Mrs. Aaron)


Third graders in math group have been working on the challenge of finding \$100 words!


