# **Message from the Principal**

Black History Month - As part of our celebration of Black History Month, the Martha Jones school jazz band will be performing Jazz music during our 2nd (grades 1 & 4) and 3rd (grades 2 & 5) lunch periods on Thursday. Please know that I recognize that Black history should not be confined to one month a year and we continually work to ensure that our curriculum instructional and materials and practices are representative and inclusive throughout the school year. # **Classroom Happenings**

#### **News from 4W (Mrs. Waldner)**

In 4w, we have learned about potential and kinetic energy and investigated forms of energy that help us move, create light, heat, makes technology work, and things grow. Then last week, we explored the idea of what else could power cars. The students created rubber-band cars that they wound-up to power the car's movement. This investigated the relationship between energy and speed.

The first challenge was to create a car that actually moved! Many students problem solved through engineering challenges. The goal was for students to power their cars enough to reach a targeted area but not too much that it goes through the zone.

As scientists, students used repeated trials to reach their goal. When one car did not travel far enough, we wound up the car less and vise versa. Through teamwork, students achieved the task, and we were able to power their rubber-band cars successfully into the target zone. They did great! After we met our class challenge, students were all able to play with their cars and use the engineering design process with their knowledge of energy and speed to hit the target zone individually. Not only were we able to get into

the target zone, a few students actually hit the target within the zone! It was a lot of fun to play with science while learning! Great job scientists in 4W.









#### **News from 2H (Ms. Hartwell)**

Wampanoag Visit - The students of Martha Jones are so lucky to have enrichment programs. The programs extend and add to the various curriculum areas. Recently, Second Grade had a visitor from Plimoth Plantation who spoke of the Wampanoag tribe. He is a native person who teaches children how

the native people lived long ago. Our children explored four areas that supported the survival of the Wampanoag people: food and water, shelter, tools, and clothing. What was exciting about the visit was, not only the interactions and discussions, but also the objects the children got to touch and explore. The children were able to feel furs, handle tools, and look at pottery. Hearing our visitor talk, the children further understood the effects of the seasons and how people long ago adapted to the land where they lived. It was a presentation 2H completely enjoyed.

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
