#### **News from 5R (Ms. Reed)**

Fifth-grade scientists have been learning all about States of Matter! They started by measuring the mass

of substances and adding heat to change them from solids to liquids. Next, they measured the mass again to see if there was any change in mass when matter changes states. After eliminating outside factors such as evaporation, 5R scientists determined that even

when matter changes states, the mass stays the same! Up next, they will be investigating measurable properties of matter including magnetism, size, and weight.





#### **News from 2M (Ms. Mundy)**

The second graders celebrated the 100th Day of School with three very special 100- year-old visitors from Fox Hill Village! Ms. Mundy's and Ms. Hartwell's classes enjoyed an afternoon with Miss Gorman (101),



Mrs. Carroll (98) and Mr. Podger (97). Students had many questions to ask about what life was like growing up 100 years ago. We learned about the early models of the automobile, telephone, and television. Students were surprised to find out that Mr. Podger still remembered his phone number as a child, and it only consisted of two digits! Our guests remembered living through exciting moments in history like The Great Molasses Flood of Boston in 1919, Martin Luther King Jr's "I Have a Dream" speech, and Apollo 11 - the spaceflight that landed the first two people on the moon. The students learned that all of our guests walked home from school for lunch and returned back to school each afternoon. Life was quite different 100 years ago! The students and our special guests thoroughly enjoyed their time together!








Here are just a few classroom happenings that took place during Black History Month.

**News from KL (Mrs. Layton)** What is Black History Month?

Black History Month is a month-long recognition of the achievements and accomplishments of African









struggles of African Americans and those who stood up for what was right (Harriet Tubman, Martin Luther King, Jr., Rosa Parks). Our discussions coincided with our Making Shapes math unit. The kids had a wonderful time creating objects out of shapes that reminded them of important figures during Black History Month. Enjoy!

Mrs. Luskin's Class Recognizes Black History Month -

It is a regular part of our class to read books with diverse settings, characters, and themes. Our class has been focusing on characters that show "grit". One such character is Ayanna Najuma. Students read and performed a reader's theater about her and the sit-ins she took part in. We then used this reading as a model for a character trait project.

## Ayanna Najuma



Ayanna Najuma was a second-grader who grew up in the 1950s in Oklahoma when the law made black and white people segregated She and other children were trained to sit in all-white restaurants so that the restaurants would have to serve black customers too.

Ayanna Najuma was determined to change the laws about segregation in her town. For example, she trained hard to do sit-ins at all-white restaurants. This shows that she was determined to changes the laws by being committed to learn ways to do sit-ins peacefully. Another example that Ayanna is determined is when she stayed seated all day in a restaurant when she was not served. This shows determination because it was difficult for her to sit all day without food and drink and with white people treating her nastily. Lastly, Ayanna showed determination when she went back to the same restaurant two more times to do a sit-in. She was not going to give up until she got served her food and drink order. Ayanna Najuma's determination helped change the laws of segregation in her town, and she inspired others to do the same.

#### **News from Music (Mrs. Saada-Smith)**

5<sup>th</sup> Graders in Mrs. Saada-Smith's music class have been learning about



rhythm. They began the unit, "How Does Music Unite Us" by drumming African rhythms together using many different percussion instruments in the music room such as djembes, gangkogui and shekeres. After they learned to play as an ensemble,

the students learned an upliftina sona, Sansa Kroma, a song often sung by children in Ghana that goes along with a stone

passing game (which they played in small groups). The song is a reminder that the whole village is there to take care of them. This past week, the students put together a percussion ensemble and created their own




