Each student plays a part in the mission, interacts with at least one

physical hands-on lab, and is responsible for finishing several tasks. Teamwork is crucial because if one member of the class fails to complete his or her job, the entire mission may be at risk.

News from Literacy (Ms. Child)

First Grade Readers! Our first-grade students have grown immensely over

the past several months. First grade is a huge year of growth for these young readers and writers. Students go from recognizing only a few words to recognizing many, many words with ease and automaticity. Additionally, they have many tools for solving hard words. They are learning to use more than one strategy, while thinking about what makes sense and sounds riaht. Durina reading workshop, the students have



opportunity to make their own book choices, practice strategies on their own and with a partner, and

share their thoughts and ideas. It is wonderful to see them read with stamina and independence!





News from 3M (Ms. MacDonald)



The students in 3M are working on interpreting and solving multiplication and division stories. We were using the computer program Quizlet Live to collaborate and work together in teams of 3. Their goal was to be the first team to accurately match math stories to the correct quantities by using images of arrays.



News from Music (Mrs. Pickering)

The 3rd-grade musicians from Mrs. Luskin's class are in their Recorder Unit. The students have been working on creating a good tone on their instrument, reading and responding to musical notation, and playing together as a musical ensemble. This week, the students have created their own compositions and recorded a video performing their piece. Finally, the students uploaded their work to their digital portfolio in seesaw that is shared with families. Enjoy!









News from 4B (Ms. Bass)



In 4B, we just launched a unit in math new focusing on size, shape and symmetry. We began with an examination of linear measurement, including U.S. standard and metric units. Several objects in the classroom - including desk edges, door frames, pencils and folders - were measured in student partnerships to



reacclimate students to different units of measure, and 2) help students to develop common points of reference

2) help students to develop common points of reference (e.g., the width of a door frame is frequently the length of a yard; a staple is frequently the length of a centimeter). Recently, the fourth graders partnered up to measure the varying perimeters of these common classroom objects. It was a great exercise in teamwork, estimation, precision, and of course, strategizing to determine perimeter!


