

This is also the night of our amazing ART SHOW, so please be sure to save the date.




News from 5B (Mr. Bartlett)

Students in 5B have been practicing all year writing narratives from either the 1st or 3rd person point of view. This has led to the guestion; what does writing in the 2nd person look like?



The class started to explore this question bv reading a range of Chose Your Own Adventure stories where the authors use the pronoun you, rather than or he/she. Students are

now beginning to plan and write their own stories in small groups that follow the conventions of this style of writing. The planing of these multi-plot narratives is quite complex, as there are many story paths, endings, and loops of intersecting story parts



Coding - I had the pleasure this week of observing grade 3 students participating in their coding class.

An obstacle course was set up in the cafeteria and students had to program their robots to follow the obstacle course without crashing into any cones. Each time the robot hit a cone, the students were allowed to reprogram their robot to further the distance the robot could travel without going off course. This type of activity takes perseverance and grit, along with many tries, collaboration with your partner, and a positive attitude to stick with it until your robot successfully completes the course.




News from 1F (Mrs. Fader)

The students of 1F are getting ready to publish their very over realistic fiction



series! Students have worked hard over the last few weeks to make up characters and imagine adventures and/or trouble for their characters to face. Throughout this unit we have used mentor texts to help us become better writers. Henry and Mudge by Cynthia Rylant, has taught us to describe the setting in our books and describe our characters feelings. Goodnight Moon by Margaret Wise Brown, has taught us to include important detail through our illustrations. Students have been taking charge of their own writing by using a checklist and setting goals for themselves. Students have been most excited about wrapping up the unit by writing their own *About the Author*

page. As a final project, students will be creating their own boxed sets out of cereal boxes to put their published series books in.

This year, one of the tools that has been introduced to students who are working on improving their expressive language skills is called the *Expanding Expression Tool (EET)*, a multi-sensory approach for improving oral language and writing by Sara L. Smith, M.S., CCC-SLP, speech-language pathologist. It provides a way to teach students how to give informative descriptions and definitions. It is perfect for

children who have difficulty organizing their thoughts and knowing what information is pertinent to their audience. The EET provides

visual and tactile cues to facilitate learning and it can easily be adapted to curriculum assignments involving oral language and written expression. The tool can also be used to help students with word retrieval difficulties by providing a structure to describe the word to their communication partners. The EET strand has five parts, the first green bead stands for "group" or the category the item belongs to, the blue one stands for "blue do" or what you do with it, the bead with the eye stands for "What does it look like?", the tan one is "What is it made of?", the pink one stands



for "parts", the white is "Where do you find/use/see it?" and the orange bead with the question mark stands for "What else do I know?". The sequence of lessons begins with describing simple objects and then ultimately moving to curriculum content and writing.
