
Classroom Happenings

News from 40 (Ms. O'Toole)




In 4-0, we have read a number of realistic fiction stories. As we read, we pay close attention to the key elements of this genre: main character, the setting, kick-off (the character's main problem or goal), rising action, climax

resolution. Two helpful tools: a Story Grammar Marker and a Story Arc help us name these important elements. A Story Grammar Marker (also known as Braidy) is a hands-on reminder of the elements that make up a great story. Each 4-0 student has his/her own personal Braidy. Our Braidy icons have been added onto a story arc to serve as a visual organizer. As writers of realistic fiction, we are discovering the many decisions an author makes regarding these story elements. Who is my main character - inside and out? What is the character's kick-off? How many places will my character travel to? How much time will pass till there is a resolution? How will the main character change by the end of the story? As a class, 4-0 gave valuable input into the main character of our class story: 4-0's Ideas for our Main Character. 4-0 writers are also very excited about the realistic fiction stories they are creating, eager to develop the necessary story elements with peer collaboration.



News from 30 (Mrs. Ogozaly)

Students in 30 have been exploring and expanding their understanding of the base-ten number system. This is a foundational skill that will support their learning throughout the year. Students have been playing various math games in order to develop and strengthen their understanding of place




value. Capture 5 is a game that allows students to make logical decisions about moving a game piece around a 100s chart. Their goal is to find combinations of moves that will lead them to a specific spot on the chart.





Once we were comfortable with the 100s chart, we began to explore the 1000s chart. Students searched for patterns and compared their findings to what we had noticed on the 100s chart. We are off to a great mathematical year here in 30!

News from KM (Mrs. McDonough)

Writer's Workshop is up and running in KM! We kicked off our unit by reading <u>Pancakes For Breakfast</u> by Tomie Depaola. This is a wordless picture book that tells an entire story. Through this we learned that we can tell out stories through detailed pictures. Every Monday the students have been writing a weekend story in their journals. They picture what they did in their minds, then draw it so readers can feel like they were there too. Our motto is "When you're done, you've just begun!" When we finish a piece of writing we can go back and add details to the picture, add labels or words, or add sentences. Our favorite part is sharing our stories with the class.










News from Art (Mrs. Pasquan)
