**Teachers as Learners -** At Wednesdays' professional development, all elementary staff participated in a district wide workshop with author Jessica Minahan. Ms. Minahan is the author of *The Behavior Code: A Practical Guide to Understanding and Teaching the Most Challenging Students* and *The Behavior Code Companion Strategies, Tools, and Interventions for Supporting Students with Anxiety-Related or Oppositional Behaviors.* While Ms. Minahan focused the workshop on supporting students with attention and anxiety difficulties, the strategies, teaching points, and information she shared is really beneficial when thinking about all students and the unique needs of students' as individuals. If you ever have the opportunity to hear Jessica Minahan speak, I highly recommend her.

**Fundraisers** - This is the time of year when many of you many be asking yourselves, "How many fundraisers does this school do?" Please know that the PTO fundraisers and events are heavy in the Fall for a few reasons:

- 1. The original works fundraiser and current scripts fundraisers are done at this time to allow you to order items for the holiday season. Grandma, Aunts and Uncles, Godparents, and others love getting notecards, mugs, and calendars with your child's artwork. This is a unique way to celebrate your child's creativity while doing your holiday shopping all at once. The Scripts fundraiser (see more information below) is a great way to support the school without spending any additional money. Many of us buy gift certificates for holiday gifts, graduation presents, birthdays, and weddings. Why not get those same gift certificates through scripts? It cost you no more, the gift certificate continues to be worth its full value, and a percentage of the amount of the gift certificate is returned to the Martha Jones School a win-win for everyone. Some people even buy certificates to local supermarkets and other places they regularly shop. They know they'll spend the money and we get funds to support our programs.
- 2. Having fundraisers early in the year allows us to have money available for programs that might come up sooner rather than later. While the majority of the programs and field trips are done in the Spring, once all the fundraisers are completed, it makes sense to do some earlier in the school year.
- 3. Some of our fundraisers seem more timely than others in terms of opportunity. We decided to hold the Savers fundraiser when we thought many of you would be cleaning out your summer clothes and be getting ready for fall and winter. **We donated over 9,000 lbs of clothing and raised \$2,300 towards our PTO budget.** If you didn't get a chance to go through your clothes, no worries. There has been a few suggestions to do another clothing drive at the end of the school year, so save those donations.

Please know that I appreciate your generosity and commitment to our school community and the fun and engaging activities that are provided by our PTO. These events help build our school community and support the culture of home/school partnerships. Hope to see everyone at the Halloween Celebration on Friday, October 26th. This is a free family event sponsored by the PTO.


practiced while reading out loud to a child. A week ago in Room 105, we finished our first read aloud "Gooney Bird Greene" by Lois Lowry. Years ago,

One habit we have been working on is doing something

been working with their reading buddies on a "5 Finger Retell". They make a fist and put a finger up for each part of their retell. Students are practicing using words such as "first, next, then, after that, and finally" when retelling a book. The students continue to practice these skills and build their reading stamina every day. We have made it to 15 minutes of quiet independent reading!


#### **News from Ms. Mulhern**

In the Learning Center we are exploring the world of flexible seating. In our room we have currently have six options of seats, aside from the normal desk chair: a bean bag

chair, yoga ball (in a stabilizing stand), basic stool, wobble stool, desk chair with a stretchy kick band and desk

chair with balance disk. The students have been given an opportunity to explore the choices in our room. We have developed flexible seating expectations for the room, students are working to find what works best for them. Flexible seating creates a fun and comfortable learning environment where students feel as if they are able to communicate their needs and are given a choice when it comes to their learning. Flexible seating provides sensory input which can help children focus and process the information they are learning. Flexible seating students to wobble,

rock, or bounce, which increases oxygen flow to the brain, allowing students to have more on-task behavior. We were fortunate enough to have the support of the PTO in our quest for more Occupational Therapy tools in the Learning Center. We were given money to make some purchases over the summer and are very grateful for this opportunity.
