Classroom Happenings

News from 4B (Ms. Bass)

In 4B, the students have embarked on their next writing unit: the composition of personal essays. Before the



students take on the challenge of writing these essays, though, it is critical that they participate in the exercise of "prewriting" to develop and nurture ideas. The fourth graders have learned a number of strategies to assist in the task of prewriting: thinking about life issues, reflecting on the individuals who matter in their lives, studying samples of "free writing," and using elaboration prompts to push their thinking toward novel insights. Just this week, the fourth graders returned to

previously written notebook entries to "mine for ideas" and ask questions such such as "what does this teach me about life?" and "what do I want readers to know about this?" In doing so, the students were pressed to look for the common, underlying themes that will ultimately be developed into more extensive personal essays.





News from 2M (Ms. Mundy)

The students in Ms. Mundy's class have been doing some deep thinking about addition and subtraction story problems and how these problems relate to one another. Addition and subtraction problems can be written in many different ways and they can also be solved in more than one way. The most important part of problem-solving is figuring out what information is known and what information we need to figure out. Students have learned that mathematicians carefully follow a number of steps to help them accurately solve problems. Mathematicians read the problem more than once to gather and identify information.





Then they visualize the problem to figure out what information is known and what information is missing. Most problems are made up of a "part/part/total". If we are given two parts, we can add them to find the total. If we are given the total and one of the parts, we can either subtract the part from the total or start with the part and see how far we have to "add up" to get to the total. With some help from Mrs. Aaron, we have even started some work with algebra problems! These problems may contain no numbers at all! Being mathematicians is hard work, but lots of fun!



News from Music (Mrs. Pickering)

The Martha Jones 4th grade musicians have been focusing on





Instrument Exploration. The students are understanding that musical instruments can be grouped into families due to their material, how you play them

and how they sound. Each described as its Tone Color.



Each instrument has its own special sound

The students worked with a partner or small group to create their own verse for the "Orchestra Song". The 4th graders chose an instrument to write about and tried to imitate the instrument's Tone



Color with their voice. Finally, the students recorded themselves singing their verse.

News from Art (Mrs. Pasquan)



Kindergarten students have been exploring shapes, colors, printmaking, and painting in the art room. Last week we discussed circles, and where we can find them in our

environment. Plastic cups, marker tops, and masking tape rolls were a few examples mentioned that we dipped into paint to make abstract circle prints. During the second class,

students used liquid watercolors to add color to their prints.
