Arrival and Dismissal - Children should be in school by 8:45 and Dismissal is at 3:10 - Carpool - If you are picking up in carpool, PLEASE have a sign in the front passenger window with your child's last name on it. While we know many of you, it is difficult to see through most of the tinted windows when we are going down the line quickly and having your child's name clearly displayed in the window is very helpful!!! This helps to keep the carpool lane moving. Thank you!

I encourage all of you to select "yes" for media permissions. This allows your child to be in school photographs on our website and participate in photos during special events. ## **Classroom Happenings**

**Classroom Happenings -** For those of you who are new to Martha Jones School, each *Leaps and Bounds* features a few "Classroom Happenings." I hope you enjoy this quick peek into some of the wonderful things that are going on in classrooms each day.

#### News from 5P (Mr. Parkhurst)



Students in Mr. Parkhurst's class have had a fantastic transition to the 5th grade. They came into the class filled with enthusiasm and curiosity. On the second day of school, we began



diving into our Investigations math curriculum. The first unit taught is titled, "Thousands of Miles, Thousands of Seats". In this math unit, students will be extending their knowledge of the number

system to 100,000 and beyond. They will be using a variety of strategies to add and subtract larger numbers and will be building up their computational



fluency. In one of the first lessons within this unit, students

worked with a 10,000 chart. The purpose of this chart is to help students understand the place-value relationships between 10, 100, 1,000, and 10,000. The chart is also helpful with adding and subtracting multiples. The students did an amazing job working collaboratively in their math groups to complete all of their given tasks.

News from 4B (Ms. Bass) In 4B, the students have embarked on their first



unit of study in math workshop: representing multiplication arrays. Thus far, the students have been working to represent multiplication situations, use arrays to find

factors, and to develop math fluency as it relates to multiplication combinations through 12 x 12. Just this week, the fourth graders learned how to play "Factor Pairs" using array cards. The use of an array allows students to visually understand the concept of

multiplication while developing strategies for determining the product with flexibility. For this particular math game, the students worked in partnerships to determine the product, share their thinking and

strategizing, and review various multiplication combinations. 4B math learners are off to a great start!

News from 1K (Mrs. Kyvelos - The first graders in 1K have been having a blast building their



classroom community. Spending time in September to reflect on summer adventures, reconnect with old friends, open hearts to new friends, and to get to know Mrs. K. is invaluable as the students build a solid foundation for the learning experiences ahead. The students have enjoyed learning and practicing new classroom routines, sharing about their passions, experimenting with classroom tools, and reading many books to support their work as first graders.






