Drop Off/Pick Up and Traffic Patterns - When arriving or leaving school, please enter via Martha Jones Road and exit via Spruce Drive. Parents should only park in front of the school in marked parking spots. All students who attend extended day should be picked up at the extended day entrance. You can enter this parking area from the driveway that runs along the side of the gym. Please enter from Martha Jones Road and take a right immediately before the school building. When exiting this parking area, all traffic should turn right along the school and exit via Spruce Drive. **Keeping the school traffic flowing in one direction, entering from Martha Jones Road and exiting via Spruce Drive is very helpful at all times.**






Classroom Happenings

News from 4L (Mrs. Luskin)



Students in fourth grade are bursting with excitement about volcanoes in science! We have been learning about where they usually happen and why they happen. In a recent lab investigation, students in 4L discovered how volcanoes explode. Students learned that there are two basic kinds of volcanoes (cone and shield volcanoes) and they release lava differently. To help them understand this, students took part in a simulation with thin and thick "lava" and made the lava bubble up by blowing into a straw. Then, they poured the lava to see how it acted once it was released. At the end of the investigation, students were able to make the connection between the different kinds of volcanoes and the type of lava that is released from them.



News from Art (Mrs. Pasquan)



Kindergarten students spent the first three classes exploring different centers in the art room. During the first class, we used supplies from the Drawing Center to create covers for our sketchbooks. During the second class, we used materials from the Collage Center to create robot collages inspired by Boy and Bot by Amy Dyckman. We spent the third class, using materials from the Painting Center to create paintings inspired by The Dot by Peter Reynolds. We spent time talking about how to set up and clean up materials from each center. Moving forward, students are now allowed to use drawing, collage, and painting supplies whenever they have free time in Art.



News from 3Le (Ms. LeBlanc)

Students in 3Le have had a terrific start to the school year! After a few days of getting to know each other and learning classroom rules and routines, the students were eager and ready to dive into their math investigations! We started by reviewing and expanding on prior knowledge of place value. Students worked in partnerships and small groups to build structures using base ten blocks. After completing a structure, students were asked to calculate the value of it, then manipulate the blocks to add or subtract from the value. We have also enjoyed learning and playing lots of math games together that allow us to practice our super skills! Two class favorites are Close to 100 and Knock the Block Off. In Close to 100 students select from 6 cards to make an equation that gets them as close to a sum of 100 as possible. During Knock the Block Off students are working on building addition fact fluency with sums within 20. They roll 3 dice, add up the sum, and place a tile to claim the number as theirs on a board. If someone else gets the same sum however, they get to "knock your block off"! It has been a fun challenge for students to get 5 blocks in a row. It is shaping up to be an exciting and eventful year of mathematics in 3rd grade!



News from KM (Mrs. McDonough)

Kindergarten is off and running! The students in KM have been learning many new routines and expectations while having a lot of hands on fun. We have started on the path of becoming Super Readers, studying the pictures of learn-about-the-world books while reading independently and with a partner.

We have started becoming authors, writing and sharing weekend stories in our journals. We have learned the routine of math workshop while exploring the manipulatives we will be using this year. And a highlight so far would be the creation of our class terrarium with guest star, science guru, Ms. O'Toole!

2) Education Plan Presentation


December 9 and December 12 at 7:00 p.m. at the Thurston Middle School cafeteria

Where: Islington Community Center; Hanlon, Sheehan and Martha Jones Extended Day programs



Each Box Top is worth 10¢ for our school; Martha Jones can use this money to help pay for school supplies, fund field trip expenses and other fun events!


