Message from the Principal



It's hard to believe we've already had our 1st snow day. Let's hope it is one and done. While it is nice to have a surprise day off in the winter, making it up in June is no fun.

Professional Development Day - As you know, on December 2nd we had a full day of professional development. The elementary staff spent part of the day working with the architects learning about and sharing ideas for the school building project. As you know, there have been a number of community meetings, with two more this week, as well as meetings with principals and administrators. The project coordinators are working to ensure they get input from all stakeholders and it was great for the teaching staff to have a chance to share their ideas, hopes, suggestions, and concerns about the building project. For the remainder of the day, the teachers worked to identify and develop professional practice learning groups. Group topics were developed based on teacher input and interest. These professional learning groups will come together over the next few months to focus on specific areas of learning and growth. Staff identified 25 different focus areas and groups were formed based on teacher interest. A sampling of the topics included are: The Impact of the Physical Environment on Learning and Well-Being, Best Practices for Student Learning in Special Education Programs, Strategies for Improving Math Fluency, Using Reading Response Journals in Strategy Reading Groups, Toolkits for Literacy Interventions, Effective Coaching and Mentoring, Keeping Students Engaged During Instruction, Strategies for Managing Stress and Anxiety, and The practices of the "Workshop" Style Instruction Across Content Areas.

Classroom Happenings

News from 3Le (Ms. LeBlanc)

Students in 3Le have enjoyed exploring our first science unit, Objects and Motion. Over the past few weeks students have been investigating the question, "How do balanced and unbalanced forces affect objects?" Students had the opportunity to engage in hands on learning during 6 different motion stations. The students worked in small groups to complete various tasks that tested how changing the height, mass, or distance of an object affects its motion. At one learning station, students built ramps of varying heights and conducted multiple trials to observe how changing the height of the ramp affects the distance a toy car travels. This



activity supported the learning that students have been engaging in during a new math unit on measurement, and allowed students to practice measuring height and distance in centimeters with rulers. At another station, students were instructed to roll a golf ball then a ping pong ball down a ramp to hit an empty crayon box. Students again practiced their measuring skills by using a ruler to calculate and compare which ball pushed the box further. Following the stations, students participated in discussions about their findings and what patterns they noticed. Students in 3Le have also been utilizing a class favorite website,



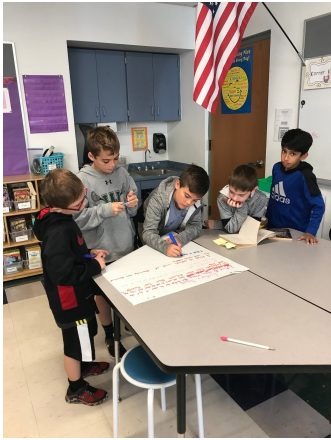
Quizlet Live, to review key vocabulary and findings from the learning stations. We are looking forward to continuing our learning as we explore how friction and magnetic forces can also have an impact on objects and motion.

News from Ms. Eaton

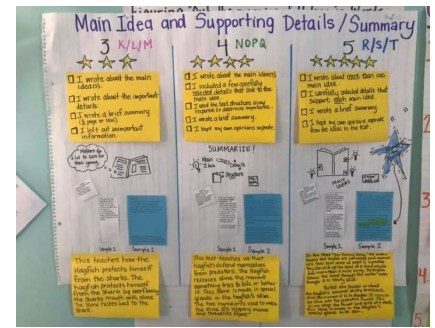
In the Learning Center, we are taking the initiative to incorporate more purposeful movement into the academic lessons. In a course entitled *Move to Learn* presented by two Westwood teachers, the importance and effectiveness of **active learning** was highlighted. Through participation and discussion of the four levels of active learning, it was made evident, the positive impact that exercise and movement have on executive functioning. Given work with basic sentence structure (**subject + predicate**), second graders were tasked with distinguishing between the two by choosing cards that had either a subject (noun) or predicate (verb) printed on them. After reading the chosen word aloud, the students had to state whether the word was a subject or predicate, locate the corresponding column and then choose an exercise to perform for 10-15 seconds (**strength training** for **subjects** and **cardio** for **predicates**). Not only did the students learn and apply these concepts, they

were fully engaged and had fun at the same time!

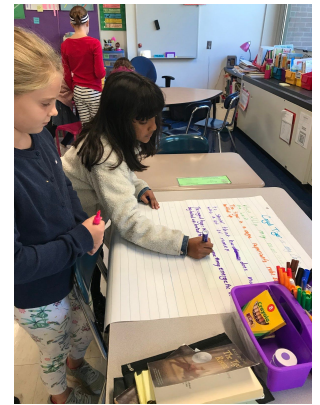
News from Literacy (Ms. Wyler)



In Readers' and Writers' Workshop, students in all grades are continually working to "make their good reading and writing even better". One way that students are learning to lift the level of their work is through the use of progressions. Progressions are descriptions and examples of thoughts about books and/or samples of writing. The children are learning that they can use these samples and descriptions to identify things they are already doing well and what goals they can set for themselves to improve.

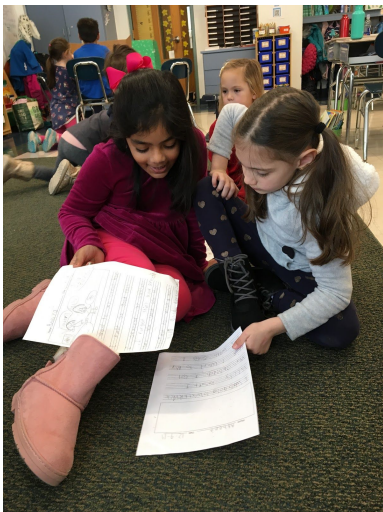


Using these resources allows the children to take ownership over their learning and reinforces a growth mindset in recognizing that no matter where your work falls along the progression, there are always steps to take to grow your thinking.



News from 1K (Mrs. Kyvelos)

The first graders in 1K have been living 'readerly' and 'writerly' lives since the beginning of the school year. Something they have worked really hard on is learning with partners to reinforce reading and writing strategies.



Partner time during Reader's Workshop occurs after a short strategy-based mini-lesson, for example, breaking tricky words into more manageable and recognizable parts. This is followed by private reading time to apply learned strategies on independent texts, and finally partner time to enjoy texts together and to share feedback on how things are going.



One of the students' favorite routines is the partner 'fishbowl,' which means that the class chooses a partnership that has worked hard to integrate reading strategies, including carrying on a back-and-forth conversation about their reading. The partnership sits in the center of the circle with their books, inside the 'fishbowl,' and the students on the outside look in to notice how the partnership works together. The students on the outside pay careful attention to how the partners remind each other of strategies to solve tricky words or to understand the text. This format excites the readers and reinforces their reading journey. Finally, these same reading partners can also meet up during Writer's Workshop to use their own published texts to strengthen their writing through the eyes of a reader. It's been great fun to witness partnerships sharing in the joys of reading and writing together!

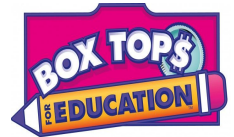
