Message from the Principal

Spring Activities - As we head into Spring, we are working to bring back many of our pre-COVID student experiences. Enrichment programs are back up and running; we will be having the Art Show and are hopeful we can do the Science Fair again (both are tentatively scheduled for June 2nd); we will start planning for field day soon; our 5th grade parent volunteers are thinking about the best ways to celebrate our students heading off to middle school; the PTO is holding the Parent Social; and we are planning an abridged version of mini-courses. Spring is always a busy busy time and it is feeling like that again :).

These programs often depend on parent volunteers and parent and/or student participation. MCAS Schedule - Students in grades 3, 4, and 5 will be taking MCAS (Massachusetts Comprehensive Assessment System) this spring. These assessments are held in school and typically take about 2 hours per session, with two sessions per content area. Dates for Martha Jones are: ELA (grades 3, 4, & 5) will be held on April 12th and 13th, Math (grades 3, 4, & 5) on May 9th and 10th and Science (grade 5 only) on May 18th and 19th. For those of you who are unfamiliar with MCAS and/or would like more information, I will hold a parent meeting on Wednesday, March 30th at 9:00 in the school cafeteria. There will also be an option to zoom in. I will send out all the details to parents of students in grades 3, 4 & 5 later next week.

Bus Registration is now open for the 2022-2023 school year!

The District kindly asks families to register between March 1st and June 30th (so our bus coordinator can work on fine tuning the routes.) Classroom Happenings

News from 4B (Ms. Bass)

4B students are currently immersed in a physical science unit: the study of energy. For this unit, students have been studying the principles of energy through a range of hands-on activities and facilitated discussions. Thus far, the fourth graders have learned a number of fundamental concepts: energy can be transferred; all things have energy (kinetic or stored); there are many types of



energy; there is a relationship between gravitational (height) energy and speed. More

recently, the fourth graders have been exploring the concept of chain reactions as a means of energy transference. As pictured, each student was tasked with the challenge of transferring energy in the following sequence: one's hand, a lever, the top of a





ramp, a marble, and a dixie cup at the bottom of the ramp! With a bit of trial and error, each student successfully completed the challenge. Next up in science: electrical energy!

The Bridge Challenge! Students in 3 Lane put their engineering skills to the test during this STEM activity called The Bridge Challenge. The students learned about real-life bridge design and combined it with their knowledge of forces to build bridge strong that а supports as many pennies as possible -- using only paper!

The Martha Jones Musicians have been celebrating Irish music in honor of St. Patrick's Day. First Grade students danced with a rainbow band to the traditional Irish music "Rakes of Mallow". The students also played hand drums with claves to imitate the Irish drum called a bodhrán to the song "Britches Full of Stitches".



News from Literacy (Ms. Child)

Praise for Perseverance!

Recently, as I walked in one of the first grade classrooms, the kids were singing "Be the Boss of Your Reading.(Calkins, Units of Study for Teaching Reading, 2015)" This song, sung to the tune of "If you're happy and you know it," reminds kids to persevere when reading gets tough. Perhaps one the most important things we can teach our children is perseverance. Even at a very young age, children will need to persevere when learning to read. First grade readers are learning many strategies for solving unknown words. At this point in the year, students are reading more difficult texts. As a result, they face more complex words and phrases and will need to use more than one strategy to solve unknown words. Students have tools they can rely on! Whether students are thinking about the story and pictures to word solve or using letters, sounds and word parts-they can do it! They are the bosses of their reading! Perseverance is a skill that children will use in mathematics, writing, on the ball field, in music classes and in their relationships. In learning (and in life!), as children become more comfortable with a productive struggle, they are learning to endure and work through problems. In the end they will feel the amazing satisfaction of having tackled a challenge. If you see your child persevering through a challenging book, math problem, assignment or situation, applaud their efforts! Finally, here are some first grade readers sharing tools to persevere to solve hard words. Enjoy!
