News from KL (Mrs. Layton)








Recently, we have been comparing numbers during our Math Workshop in our Kindergarten classroom. Comparing numbers is an important part of building a student's number sense. Number sense is

News from Art (Mrs. Friberg)








A Look Inside the Art Room with Mrs. Friberg

News from Literacy (Ms. Child)







Beginning Readers are Reading Decodables!

This year you may see your children coming home with decodable texts! Wiley Blevins, a leading researcher in reading instruction, describes a decodable text as, "a story or book that is controlled based on the phonics skills taught up to that point . . . that is the majority of words in a decodable text can be sounded out based on the sound spelling relationships that students have learned."

type of decodable text a student is reading depends on where they are in their understanding of phonic concepts. A well written decodable text will be comprehensible, will include words from a child's vocabulary, and will include spelling pattern correspondences that were previously taught. Our youngest learners will need to spend a good chunk of time in decodable texts, so that they can apply taught phonic skills and concepts. Decodable texts provide important opportunities to young readers- including a chance to use letter sound relationships repeatedly. Repeatedly using letters and sounds to decode words, will help readers to store words so that they, eventually, can be read words automatically. If your child is reading a decodable text at home, encourage them to look at the word, and slide through each sound (Duke, 2020). Let your child read and reread their decodable text. They will feel a sense of pride and accomplishment as their hard work will have paid off!
