Principals Message

MJ Community,

Over the coming weeks the classroom teachers, special education teachers, specialists, school psychologist, and I will begin the process of class placement for <u>August 2025</u>. During the placement process, it is important for us to consider all relevant information. We review information about each child's academic, social, and personal characteristics and use that information when making placement decisions. Our primary goal is to assign each child to a classroom in which they can develop academically and socially.

If you have information about your child's learning needs that you would like to share, please send me your input via email (mkuklentz@westwood.k12.ma.us) and your child's classroom teacher by Tuesday, April 29, 2025. Although you may have discussed class placement with your child's teacher, special educator or Ms. MaryKate Stimpson during conferences and meetings, all requests must be sent to me. Parent letters received will be compiled into a document separate from the final lists and distributed to the placement team members for consideration. Please note that letters and emails are not kept from previous years since children change and grow, and we make decisions based on current information.

If you are the parent of multiples (twins, triplets, etc), you may specify whether you want your children placed in the same class or different classes. Also, please know that if you have more than one child in your family, there is a chance that they will not have the same teachers as their siblings.

Westwood Public Schools does not allow parents to request their children's teachers; therefore, requests for specific teachers will not be accepted or considered. The process is both thoughtful and thorough. As Principal, I approve the final placement decision. The staff and I appreciate your cooperation and support as we begin this process.

Finally, there is no requirement to submit a placement letter.

Please contact me if you have any questions about the process. Thank you for your continued support.

Allergies

Allergies are caused by the body's reaction to substances called "allergens," which trigger the immune system to react to harmless substances as though they were attacking the body. Allergic rhinitis is an inflammation of the nasal membranes and eyes caused by certain particles in our environment (like, pollen and molds, or dust mites and animal dander).

The symptoms of allergic rhinitis

- Runny nose
- Sneezing
- Itchiness of the eyes, nose and throat
- Headache and fatigue can be symptoms sometimes

How can you minimize exposure to seasonal allergy triggers?

- Wash hands and face when coming inside come from playing outside so pollen is not rubbed in eyes and nose
- Take a shower at night before bedtime to wash off any pollen
- Do not bring items from outside into the bedroom
- Keep windows in your home and car closed when possible
- Check the forecast for pollen levels, and limit outdoor activities when pollen counts are higher For more information regarding Spring Allergies please visit <u>healthy children.org</u>

Time for Tick Checks:

Everyone living in the New England area where ticks are common should perform nightly tick checks during the warm months. Rapid discovery and removal prevents ticks from transmitting diseases. Keep in mind that ticks are very small and love to be in warm dark places like the armpit, groin, around the ear and on the back of the neck.

Bike safety:

Wearing a helmet is one of the most important ways to stay safe on a bike! Bike riding is a great way for families to get some outdoor exercise; however, it's also a leading cause of injuries in children.

MCAS


We will be conducting the MCAS testing on the following dates:

News from the MJ Classroom's News from 5B (Mr. Bartlett)



The 5th graders recently went to Mars on an interplanetary field trip!

As part of our explorations into space science this year, students have been learning about the vast distances in space and the problems this poses for space travel. As a culminating activity, the 5th graders went to Framingham State University for a field trip to experience space in a planetarium and to also take part in a simulated mission to Mars. Students had to apply for a NASA mission job before leaving, and were then assigned a key role in the mission such as Life Support (LS), Medical (Med), Rover (Rov) etc. Students worked with the mission specialist from NASA to successfully land a Mars Rover and search for signs of life.

Thankfully, despite an asteroid violently hitting the Martian moon Deimos while we were there, all students made it back safe and sound to Martha Jones and learned more about how they could have a future career in a STEM field.

News from 4W (Mrs. Waldner)







In fourth grade, we are learning about the expansion of the United States (1800s). Through examining primary sources, students described the importance of the development of the Transcontinental Railroad. Students learned how the railroad impacted a variety of people, and why it was important. This led to great classroom discussions!

News from the Music Room (Mrs. Goldman & Mrs. Yennior)



On March 20, the 5th Graders welcomed Spring with a fantastic Chorus performance in a musical celebration of the Colors of the World!

5th Grade Music consists of a half year of Chorus and a half year of General Music. We will spend the remainder of the school year in General Music in a new unit called *Together We Create*. 5th graders



will be working towards playing percussion instruments (tubano / djembe drums, African bells and shekere) and creating their own 4- beat rhythms. These rhythms will be layered together to create group Rhythm Complement projects, which students will create, practice and perform for their classmates.

After working on coding skills in several different apps and platforms throughout the year, MJ students are nearly ready to begin programming their robots! Second grade starts with Ozobot Evo, third grade builds and programs Lego Milo, fourth grade works with the biggest robot - Dash, and the fifth graders will fly their drones through the air to accomplish several missions - wish us luck! :)


