Principals Message

MJ Community,

As we think about next school year, I want to take the opportunity to promote the MJ Buddy Program. It is a parent run effort to match new to MJ students and families with current MJ families to help them navigate a new school and community.

MJ Buddy Program

At MJ, we recognize that joining a new school can feel daunting for both students and

parents. Navigating unfamiliar routines, meeting new people, and learning about different events and traditions can be overwhelming. That's why we created the MJ Buddy Program. By pairing new families with seasoned volunteers who know our school well, we aim to provide a warm welcome right from the start. Through friendly guidance and ongoing communication, the Buddy Program helps newcomers find their footing socially, academically, and within the wider school community. We believe that when families feel supported from day one, everyone benefits—students form friendships more easily, parents engage more confidently, and our entire school culture becomes stronger, more inclusive, and more connected.



In the upcoming 25/26 school year the MJ Buddy Program will foster a welcoming and connected school community by offering new families in 1st grade and up, early engagement opportunities, clear information, and connection—ensuring they feel integrated and supported from day one.

Why Become a Buddy Family?

- Ease Transitions: You'll help newcomers navigate daily routines, answer questions about school events, and share insights about life at MJ.
- Foster Connections: By building these new friendships, we create a stronger, more vibrant, and connected school community.

What's Involved?

- Welcome & Orientation: Connect with new families before or at the start of the school year and offer a friendly face at key events.
- Regular Check-Ins: Reach out periodically (via text, email, phone, or in-person) to provide answers, guidance, or just to say hello.
- Introduce Opportunities: Invite new families to attend upcoming events like the

Family Picnic, Bingo Night, or Movie Night.

Allergies

Allergies are caused by the body's reaction to substances called "allergens," which trigger the immune system to react to harmless substances as though they were attacking the body. Allergic rhinitis is an inflammation of the nasal membranes and eyes caused by certain particles in our environment (like, pollen and molds, or dust mites and animal dander). The symptoms of allergic rhinitis

- Runny nose
- Sneezing
- Itchiness of the eyes, nose and throat
- Headache and fatigue can be symptoms sometimes

How can you minimize exposure to seasonal allergy triggers?

- Wash hands and face when coming inside come from playing outside so pollen is not rubbed in eyes and nose
- Take a shower at night before bedtime to wash off any pollen
- Do not bring items from outside into the bedroom
- Keep windows in your home and car closed when possible

• Check the forecast for pollen levels, and limit outdoor activities when pollen counts are higher For more information regarding Spring Allergies please visit <u>healthy children.org</u>

Time for Tick Checks:

Everyone living in the New England area where ticks are common should perform nightly tick checks during the warm months. Rapid discovery and removal prevents ticks from transmitting diseases. Keep in mind that ticks are very small and love to be in warm dark places like the armpit, groin, around the ear and on the back of the neck.

Bike safety:

Wearing a helmet is one of the most important ways to stay safe on a bike! Bike riding is a great way for families to get some outdoor exercise; however, it's also a leading cause of injuries in children.


The safety of all students depends on all drivers obeying the rules and speed limits. Please share these thoughts with others who may be picking up or dropping off your child.

News from the Math Office - Mrs. Aaron






