#### International Night Celebration FOOD ALLERGY ADVISORY

A variety of delicious foods will be available at International Night Celebration. To ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for everyone, please be aware of the following:

- Ask Before You Eat: We encourage you to inquire about ingredients before consuming any food, especially at tables with unidentified dishes. Look for signs with ingredient lists or ask a volunteer or person at the table directly.
- Limited Control Over Ingredients: Due to the diverse nature of this event, some food may be prepared in kitchens that handle allergens. We may not be able to guarantee complete absence of allergens in all dishes.
- Alternatives Available: If you are concerned about potential allergens, some tables may offer pre-packaged snacks or simpler dishes with a clear ingredient list.
- When in Doubt, Don't Eat: It's always better to be safe than sorry. If you are unsure about any ingredients, please err on the side of caution and avoid that particular dish.

Please do not hesitate to ask a parent volunteer or anyone at the table if you are unsure about any of the ingredients.

The Martha Jones community grows stronger as we learn about one another and appreciate both our shared and unique cultural experiences.

Please take a moment to talk with your children ahead of time about the many foods they may encounter—some of which may be unfamiliar. It's a great opportunity to discuss how to respond respectfully, even if they try something they don't like. (I'm still mortified by the memory of my own child saying "ewwww" when tasting a close friend's tripe recipe for the first time!)

### MCAS

We will be conducting the MCAS testing on the following dates:

May 19 and May 20 - STE (Gr. 5 only)

Each year, I have parents ask what they can do to best prepare their children. I think it's important to not do anything different. I encourage parents to prioritize good sleep and good nutrition. If your children express worry about the MCAS; tell the students that they have been well prepared.

Finally, when students take the MCAS the following items are not allowed on their person: phones and smartwatches. Please have students keep them at home.

### Allergies

Allergies are caused by the body's reaction to substances called "allergens," which trigger the immune system to react to harmless substances as though they were attacking the body. Allergic rhinitis is an inflammation of the nasal membranes and eyes caused by certain particles in our environment (like, pollen and molds, or dust mites and animal dander).

The symptoms of allergic rhinitis

- Runny nose
- Sneezing
- Itchiness of the eyes, nose and throat
- Headache and fatigue can be symptoms sometimes

How can you minimize exposure to seasonal allergy triggers?

- Wash hands and face when coming inside come from playing outside so pollen is not rubbed in eyes and nose
- Take a shower at night before bedtime to wash off any pollen
- Do not bring items from outside into the bedroom
- Keep windows in your home and car closed when possible
- Check the forecast for pollen levels, and limit outdoor activities when pollen counts are higher For more information regarding Spring Allergies please visit <u>healthy children.org</u>

### Time for Tick Checks:

Everyone living in the New England area where ticks are common should perform nightly tick checks during the warm months. Rapid discovery and removal prevents ticks from transmitting diseases. Keep in mind that ticks are very small and love to be in warm dark places like the armpit, groin, around the ear and on the back of the neck.

### Bike safety:

Wearing a helmet is one of the most important ways to stay safe on a bike! Bike riding is a great way for families to get some outdoor exercise; however, it's also a leading cause of injuries in children. Please reach out to the Health Office with any questions! Happy Spring!

#### What's Happening in Physical Education

Over the past several weeks the Martha Jones students have been participating in an educational gymnastics unit. The children spent the first few weeks working on a variety of floor skills in the areas of: traveling, balancing and rolling. The second part of the unit focused on the gymnastics equipment structure.

Gymnastic activities are a very important part of every child's experience in physical education and make a significant contribution to the goals of the curriculum. Gymnastics encompasses a variety of components such as: rolling, balancing, weight transfer and traveling on different body parts and equipment.

Participating in gymnastic activities teaches and promotes important physical values. These activities help develop muscular strength, muscular endurance, flexibility, coordination, as well as gross motor development and body control. The physical demands of holding balances, rolling, and traveling contribute to the development of overall physical fitness.


