Principal's Message

MJ,

We have a guest writer in our newsletter, Erin Aaron, Martha Jones Math Specialist:

At school, we are working hard to help every child *enjoy* math, see themselves as capable learners, and build a strong, positive math identity. This means engaging students in flexible thinking, problem-solving, collaboration, and celebrating mistakes as part of learning. Families play an important role too—simple conversations at home, such as noticing math in daily life, encouraging persistence, and sharing positive messages, make a big difference. Below is an excerpt that highlights what research tells us about how powerful adult messages can be in shaping children's confidence and achievement in math.

Excerpt from "Parents' Beliefs About Math Change Their Childrens' Achievement" Written by Jo Boaler, Stanford University

We now know that the messages we give students can change their performance dramatically, and that students need to know that the adults in their lives believe in them. Researchers are learning that students' ideas about their ability and potential are extremely important, much more than previously understood. As well as the messages we give students about their potential, brain

research is now showing that messages students pick up from their parents about math and their parents' relationships with math can also change students' math learning and achievement.

In an important study researchers found that when mothers told their daughters they were not good at math in school, their daughter's achievement declined almost immediately (Eccles & Jacobs, 1986). In a newer study neuroscientists Erin Maloney and colleagues found that parents' math anxiety reduced their children's learning of math across grades 1 and 2, but only if parents helped their children on math homework (Maloney, Ramirez, Gunderson, Levine, & Beilock, 2015) If they did not help them on homework, the parents' math anxiety did not detract from their children's learning. The parents' math knowledge did not turn out to have any impact, only their level of math anxiety.

Both studies, again, communicate the importance of the messages students receive, as it was not math knowledge that harmed the students' performance but the parents' anxiety. We do not know what parents with math anxiety say to their children but it is likely they communicate the negative messages we know to be harmful, such as "math is hard" or "I was never good at math in school." It is critical that when parents interact with children about math they communicate positive messages, saying that math is exciting and it is an open subject that anyone can learn with hard work, that it is not about being "smart" or not and that math is all around us in the world. 5th Grade Band Concert

The students have been working very diligently on the Band music and I am very proud of their progress! Students will participate in an early evening dress rehearsal at the high school before the performance. Students will need to arrive by parent drop-off. The schedule for the evening dress rehearsal and concert is as follows:

5:30 pm Students arrive by parent drop-off at the Westwood High School Auditorium for a dress rehearsal.

6:30 pm Concert begins with the 5th Grade Band, followed by the Thurston 6th Grade Band and Jazz Band.

Mrs. Dunn's first-graders wrapped up their learning about Pilgrim and Wampanoag life with a Thanksgiving celebration last week. Students learned to play a board game called *Nine Men's Morris*, which was a popular strategy game played by both Pilgrim adults and children. They had fun trying to capture their opponent's pieces in this Tic-Tac-Toe style game. Students also learned to play the traditional Native American game *Ring and Pin*, which helped Wampanoag children strengthen their focus and develop the handeye coordination that would be needed for activities like hunting, fishing, and sewing. Students were surprised by how challenging this seemingly simple game could be! Finally, students made their own "turkeys" out of fruit, including ones native to MA like



blueberries and cranberries, and made cards for their loved ones expressing their gratitude.

News from 4W (Mrs. Waldner)







In fourth grade, students are beginning a new unit on division. This week, all fourth graders explored a multi-layered, open-ended math task involving a store owner deciding how to arrange different quantities of fruit on various sets of shelves. Working in groups of 2–3, students created different options and configurations for displaying the fruit. There was a lot of teamwork and discussion as they shared their ideas. In the end, students connected their work to division problems—recognizing that some equations make equal groups while others leave a remainder.



News from Ms. O'Brien

In the PEER Program, we are working on incorporating sensory strategies into daily learning to help students better access and engage with instruction. By intentionally addressing students' sensory needs, we create an environment where they can regulate their bodies, sustain attention, and participate more confidently. Our classroom uses flexible seating options, such as bouncy balls, spinning chairs, floor seating, and even a small trampoline, to provide movement and comfort that support focus. We also weave sensory-based educational practices into lessons whenever possible, like writing in foam, using textured materials, or engaging in hands-on, tactile activities. These approaches help students feel



grounded and ready to learn, promoting greater independence and academic success.
