Starting the Year off with Technology

Technology integration is alive and well in the Westwood Public Schools. September necessitates a review of our district CLEAR policy for grades 3 -5 (see 3/11/16 blog posting). Meanwhile, students in K - 2 focus on learning a set of responsibilities and understanding that the acceptable use of technology is for learning and education. The CLEAR acronym will be introduced to second graders in a few months.

The start of the school year is also a time to ensure student accounts are active and accessible. Third graders sign into Google Classroom & Drive for the first time. Kindergarteners get rolling with Lexia Core 5 while first and second graders dive into reading with Raz Kids. All students have access to digital math content through IXL. One of the most important messages to students at this time is the protection and privacy of their usernames and passwords.

On Tuesday, we gathered for our first monthly **All School Meeting** (ASM) in the Hanlon gymnasium. It was so special to see the entire student body and faculty gathered in one room! The vision for ASM is to bring our school together as a community, and to celebrate what is happening in and around classrooms. This year, we kicked off our ASM by sharing a story that came out of this summer's Olympics: American runner Abbey D'Agostino, and New Zealander Nikki Hamblin, tripped and fell during one of their races. Instead of getting up and running, D'Agostino stopped to help Hamblin up. Neither runner won the race that day, but both gained a new friend. This story and <u>short video clip</u> was used to set our school-wide theme for September and October: **Be Friendly**. When students are seen going the extra mile to be friendly, they are recognized with a Medal of Friendship that is hung on our Olympic bulletin board in the lunchroom. Throughout the year, we will focus on five different character themes (one for each Olympic Ring). We look forward to seeing Hanlon parents and guardians at **Curriculum Night** this Thursday, September 15th. Classroom presentations for students in Grades 3-5 will take place from 6:00-6:45. All parents are invited to gather in the gymnasium at 6:45 for a General Meeting, including my Principal's Welcome as well as presentations from PTO. Classroom presentations for students in Grades K-2 will follow immediately

At this point about half of Hanlon families have updated, and we need 100% to ensure that our PTO Directory is correct, and that our main office has the most current emergency information. The deadline to update is September 9th (today). Parents of new students and kindergarten families should pay special attention to the Media Permissions question. In order for students to have their photos in classrooms, on slideshows, in the yearbook and on the website, etc., we need the Media Permissions to say YES. School Picture Day is scheduled for Monday, September 19th. We are hoping for beautiful weather and for several volunteers from 8:45AM- 12:30PM to help keep the lines moving, entertain the children, and

Please send in a note or email your child's teacher and the Main Office any time your child's **dismissal plans** change We prepare a daily bus list for our driver, and it is essential to ensure that we account for all students., and that we know how they get home each day. Please do not bring a neighbor's child home without first obtaining permission from the parent and alerting the Main Office before leaving school grounds. While well-intended, this practice causes confusion for staff as we do our very best to track each and every child. Safety is our number one priority.

The staff parking lot was resurfaced over the summer, and we lost several **parking spaces**. As a result, additional staff have had to park along Gay St. We understand that this impacts arrival and dismissal times for families, and we thank you for understanding. Please do not park in the staff parking lot behind the school. Also, when entering the front circle, please adhere to the signs. The circle uses one-way traffic with the entry point by Laura Lane. Some cars have been entering close to main entrance, which causes a safety concern.
