Superintendent's Report (6:30-6:36)

FY'21 Budget Process Update

Ms. Parks reported that the Budget Steering Committee met again last week. They talked about the district's additional capital requests. Looking for funding in two areas: the second phase of the Thurston HVAC project at a cost of \$150K; and to continue the security updates based on the security audit for \$150K. Pam Dukeman will be taking this request to the Select Board to discuss this additional funding article. Ms. Parks met with all the cost center leaders and collected all of the budget requests. All requests exceed what we can afford to fund. She will begin to establish the priorities for the budget. Themes that are emerging: district enrollment will be stable at all levels next year, so staffing will remain stable in general classroom; general education programming will focus on middle school ELA; emerging needs in SEL; and special education. These will have short and long term implications on the budget. Will take a deep look at the structural issues in the budget with Ms. Jn-baptiste, who will be going through this budget process for the first time this year. Ms. Parks wanted to see if there would be an interest with the School Committee members to have a one hour training on special education issues. The members would like to participate. The State of MA just passed a new bill about public school funding, the Student Opportunity Act. It will increase funding by \$1.5 billion over the next several years. Foundation formula has been updated to now reflect the realities. Ms. Parks thinks Westwood will benefit from this, not a huge amount, like some other districts. It will now include transportation cost in the Circuit Breaker reimbursement. In the past it was just tuition. This will roll out in phases, not all in the first year.

Discussion Items (6:36-6:55)

English Language Arts Curriculum Recommendations (6:36-6:54)

Ms. Borchers reported.

Marcia Uretsky is the ELA and Social Studies Coordinator at the elementary level. Marisa Olivo is the Humanities Department head at the middle school, and Kate Holmes, the English Language Arts department chair at the high school, will help present.

Vision statement

- Students in the Westwood Public Schools are curious readers, critical thinkers, careful researchers, thoughtful listeners, effective writers, and powerful speakers.
- They explore, question, and analyze texts that represent diverse voices and experiences.
- They collaborate to share insights and discover new ideas.
- They speak and write to shape their lives, their communities, and their world.
- They use their developing skills to inform, persuade, create, and inspire.

K-5 highlights

- Adopt/implement Units of Study program to ensure curriculum alignment.
- Pursue interdisciplinary opportunities.
- Build flexibility into classroom schedules.

TMS

- Improve alignment through curriculum analysis and mapping.
- Identify and address specific performance drops and gaps.
- Implement intervention model.
- Create workshop-style lessons.

High School

- Vary writing tasks (add persuasive, narrative, and analysis).
- Adapt rubrics in order to provide more effective feedback.
- Provide more opportunities for student choice.

District highlights

- Diversify core and optional texts.
- Identify opportunities to teach speaking and listening skills as well as SEL competencies.
- Develop consistent approach to instruction in core skills (grammar, mechanics, handwriting, spelling, keyboarding).
- Build schedules that support instructional goals.

Ms. Plotkin asked if this is recommended this year, and implemented next year? Yes. It will take 2-3 years for it all to be rolled out.

School Committee business meeting – December 12, 2019 Page 2 of 5 Ms. Jowdy asked if Professional Development will be created regarding this new rolled alignment? Yes, it will take place next year.

Mr. Donahue asked about feedback from graduating seniors and how well prepared they felt they were for college writing? How often do they students write to prepare themselves for college writing? They write daily, it is process writing so getting feedback every step of the way. Asked if creative writing was also being worked on? There is a creative writing course for seniors but will be weaving more of this into the curriculum. He also asked about public speaking and if there had been any feedback with the Dale Carnegie program. All juniors take a public speaking class, it is a requirement for graduation. There is also public speaking in all ELA classes.
