


Classroom Happenings

News from 5P (Mr. Parkhurst)



Students in Mr. Parkhurst's fifth grade class have gone back in time! They had to imagine that they were a retired European explorer who had made several voyages to the American Colonies. They were hired to help the people of England decide which region of the colonies that they might like to settle. Their task was to research the New England, Middle, and Southern colonies using multiple digital and print resources. They then used their research to create a 3-Circle Venn

Diagram. Students had to creatively layout their ideas, add sketches, and use a variety of colors. Students then had to research, more in depth, one of the colonies. They were then tasked with persuading people to settle in their colony. They researched their chosen colony and created an advertisement that could be used to convince the people of England to move there. They presented their information in the form of a short skit in front of the class.



News from Mathematics (Mrs. Size)

Fifth graders have been busy learning strategies to compare fractions by reasoning about their relative size. For one activity, they looked at two fractions on a piece of paper and decided where they would place them according to the strategy they used to compare. Each partner in the pair had a different color, so they could see if they disagreed and then have a discussion about that. Strategy sorts allow a great way to reason about mathematics and provide good talking points for the students.



News from 2F (Mrs. Fader)

Students in 2F have just started their nonfiction reading unit. In this unit, the students will be working on

three strategies in their nonfiction books: paying attention to details, putting the parts of text together in their mind, and asking questions. To kick off the unit, students studied objects closely while thinking about these 3 goals. While reading and studying these objects closely, students used phrases such as "I wonder..." and "I notice..." while sharing their ideas with peers. Students were asking questions about different objects and



making connections to what they already knew. Students were eager to see if they could find answers to their questions and wonderings within nonfiction books. After students book shopped in nonfiction bins, students went off to read their nonfiction books while taking ownership of these 3 new goals. Students were paying close attention to all the different text features and making connections to what they read. Students were so proud when they found connections to their questions in their own book bags!



News from KM (Mrs. McDonough)

In KM we created a Number Museum this month. Every student was given a number to represent on an index card using a variety of materials. We then played Quick Images with the finished cards. In Quick Images, an image or an amount is shown only for a few seconds so that your brain has to work quickly to subitize the information so the total can be figured out without having to count by ones. The numbers were then organized on a bulletin board in the hall. Every student could study the pictures in the museum and write equations that matched how they saw the arrangement. They wrote the equation on a sticky note and stuck it under the index card. Along with having fun the students were working on many skills:

Subitizing - the ability to recognize a small group of objects without counting

Decomposing- breaking down numbers into sub-parts

Writing equations



Project Bread's FoodSource Hotline helps the most vulnerable populations in our state—elders, immigrants, and working poor families who struggle to gain access to SNAP because of stigma, confusion about eligibility, and difficulty navigating a complex application process.

WHAT IS THE FOODSOURCE HOTLINE?

The FoodSource Hotline connects people struggling to put food on the table with SNAP benefits and other food resources in their communities. The Hotline answers over 28,000 calls from food insecure families and individuals across Massachusetts each year. The multilingual staff, complemented by able translators, can assist callers in over 180 languages.



Our hotline counselors connect callers to emergency food resources in their area.

In addition to calling the hotline, people in need can also reach hotline counselors by instant message through www.gettingsnap.org.

FOODSOURCE HOTLINE SERVICES

- Screenings for SNAP/Food Stamp eligibility.
- Over-the-phone SNAP application assistance and follow up with applicants throughout the process.
- Referrals to community food programs.
- Informational resource for agencies who have specific SNAP regulation questions that are affecting their clients.
- General information to current SNAP recipients, applicants with pending applications, and those who are hesitant to apply.
- Referrals to other programs such as WIC, school meals, housing, and utility assistance.
- Information on the Healthy Incentive Program (HIP) and how to earn benefits.
