

News from the Library (Mrs. Swinning)

All grades are learning the story of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. in Library!



Grades K-3 are discussing what we know about him already and learning new facts as we explore picture books, eBooks and biographies about this amazing person in our history. We are also highlighting others who have and are working hard to make a difference in our world. Students are being encouraged to spend Monday finding a way to help someone or show someone an act of kindness.

Our Birthday Book Program is back up and running. Here are a few of our students picking their birthday books.



News from 4L (Mrs. Luskin) - Fourth graders have begun their Geometry unit! The unit consists of four investigations: linear measurement, classifying polygons, measuring angles, and symmetry and area. The past week in 4L, students were investigating linear measurement by estimating using unit benchmarks and measuring items in the room using U.S. standard and Metric tools. Students discovered that measuring accurately takes teamwork and real-world



problem-solving. Discussions ranged from what tools would be appropriate to measure with, how to measure accurately and to keep track of the segments measured, and how to convert


measurement units. Our students have advice for anyone who is measuring, "Measure *at least* twice and measure with a partner!"

News from 5G (Ms. Gross) -5th graders in Ms. Gross's class have focused on building their research skills. Most recently, the class has been researching the original thirteen colonies. Each student is focusing on one of the colonies. They are learning about when/why the colony was founded, the geography and climate of the colony,





and the people of the colony. In order to learn about the people of the colony they are researching, they are discovering what religions were practiced in the colony, what the government was like in the colony, and what the economy was like in the

colony. After they complete their research, they are working on representing their information on a poster which they will use to teach others about the colony. Their goal is to convince others to want to

come to their colony. This gives us the opportunity to practice presentation skills, as well!





News from the Speech & Language Corner, Sharyn Tucceri, MS, CCC-SLP

Sequencing is one of the many skills that is targeted with students in speech therapy. This skill contributes to a student's ability to comprehend what they read and is a key component of problem-solving across the curriculum including the subjects of math, science, social studies and writing. In the area of reading, sequencing refers to the identification of the components of a story — the beginning, middle, and end — and also to the ability to retell the events within a given text in the order in which they occurred. Sequencing events is a crucial comprehension strategy, especially for narrative texts (Reading Rockets, 2015). Having students sequence picture cards in the correct order and then tell the narrative using the time-order words *first, next, then,* and *last* helps them to practice the skill of organizing their thoughts in an efficient manner. This skill is an easy one to practice at home by having your child explain how to perform various tasks around the house such as sequencing the steps for a cooking project, brushing their teeth, or getting ready for school. You can also take 3-4 pictures of your child performing different activities and then have them describe the tasks in sequential order by starting each sentence with a time-order word (e.g., First, I got the soccer ball and put it on the ground. Next, I dribbled it toward the net with my feet. Then, I kicked the ball with all of my might toward the goal. Last, I scored!). Have fun sequencing!
