CURRICULUM NIGHT will be held Virtually on Thursday, September 23, 2021.

- Principal's Opening Remarks 6:30
 - All Parents are invited to log into the Principal's Opening Remarks at 6:30 PM. In addition to kicking off curriculum night, Dr. Tobin will be sharing her goals and aspirations for the school year, introducing the PTO chairs and SEPAC liaison, and sharing other important information. Early next week you will be receiving an email with the link to the Opening Meeting as well as short videos introducing our specialists, support staff, coaches, and other important school community members. Feel free to view these videos at your own convenience.

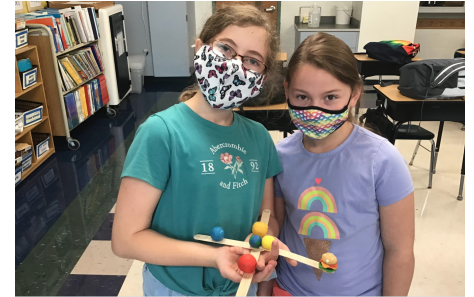
Classroom Happenings

News from 5B (Mr. Bartlett)

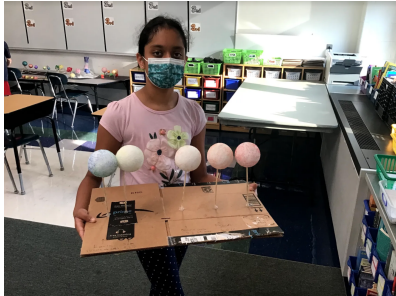
Mr Bartlett's class is currently studying space science and grappling with the guiding question; why is the sun so bright in the sky?



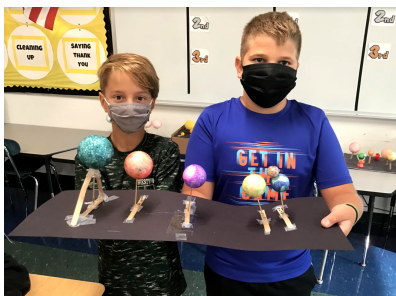
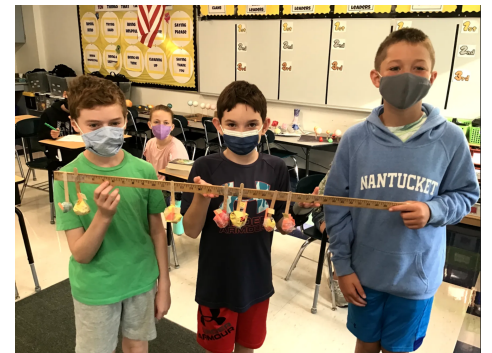
Most students start by suggesting that the sun is bright because it is really big and really hot. We address this misconception by learning about the Sun compared to other stars. Is the



Sun big? Yes, it's huge. A million Earths would fit inside the Sun! Is it really hot? Yes, incredibly hot. It's temperature is about 5,000 degrees celsius. But... lots of the other stars are even bigger and even hotter! So why does our sun look bigger and feels hotter than the other stars?



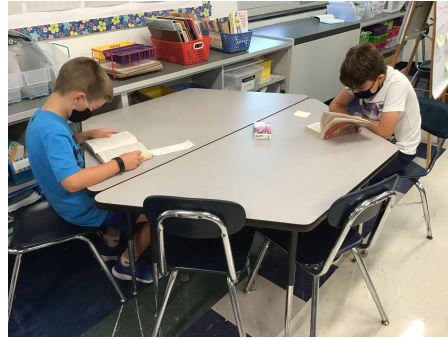
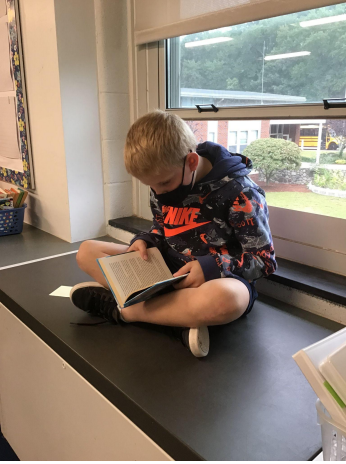
To fully understand this, students have been trying to wrap their heads around the huge distances in space, and trying to build an understanding of how close the Sun is compared to the other nearest stars. Student's learned that the Sun is 8 light minutes away from Earth, but the nearest other star, Proxima Centauri is 4.2 light years away. All the other stars are even further away than that. So compared to the other stars, the sun is basically right next to us.



But .. how can the sun be so close to us when Google says it is 93 million miles away? How can the sun be so far away, yet so close? Building a conceptual understanding of the astronomical distances involved in space can be challenging for anyone. To help better understand, students built scale models of the nearest five stars to Earth using inches or cm to represent light years.

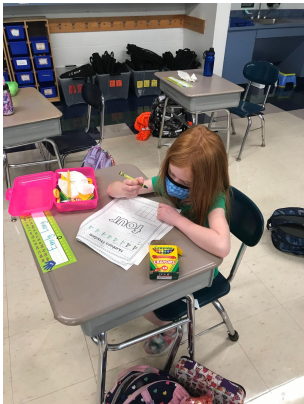
News from 4B (Ms. Bass)

In 4B, we have officially launched our reader's workshop! Our first unit of study focuses on reading works of fiction and building ideas about characters. To do this kind of work, the fourth graders have to lay the groundwork for a successful reading environment. We started the unit by reflecting on the "best and worst of times" as readers. Students asked questions of themselves: *what tells me that I'm engaged in a book? Where is a space in the classroom that feels conducive to reading? If I'm not understanding or enjoying a book, what are my next moves?* By thinking about times when reading felt uplifting and absorbing (and when it didn't feel that way), students were able to evaluate their habits as readers and make adjustments as necessary. Now every student in 4B has a book in their hands, and is ready to dig into their first unit of fiction!



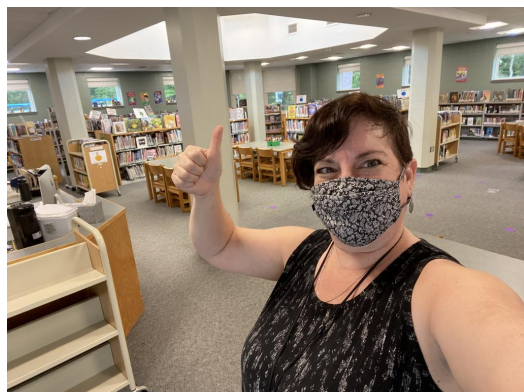
News from 1B (Ms. Brock)

First graders in Ms. Brock's class have been enjoying learning about their classmates, new classroom routines, and building a positive community! Students have learned the structure of math workshop and are building independence as they rotate through math stations in small groups. First graders have had opportunities to explore math tools such as pattern blocks, geoblocks, and snap cubes. We will be using these tools throughout the year so students are becoming familiar with how they can use them. We are also practicing counting and comparing quantities. We counted on number lines and also counted the total number of objects in "mystery boxes." First graders have lots of strategies for counting and are remembering how important it is to check their work. One fun way to practice comparing quantities is through playing math games. So far a class favorite is a game called "double compare dots" where each player turns over two cards at a time from their deck of dot cards to compare who has more. We are excited to start working on addition and to grow as mathematicians in first grade!



News from the Library (Mrs. Swinning)

It is SO GREAT to have the library up and running again! I am so happy to see all of my old friends at Martha Jones and meet all of the new ones!



We are already reading together, checking out books, laughing, singing and having a lot of fun!

Our library theme this year is **STORYTELLING**. We will be learning about the art of storytelling and the many ways it is used to share messages as well as practicing the art of storytelling ourselves!

Kindergarten and Grade 1 will be learning all about the library, how to pick a great story and how stories are different in different areas of the library. Each week they will be introduced to a new section and format!

Grade 2 is getting ready to start their travels around the world! We will be learning about, reading stories from and singing music from places all over the globe this year!

Grade 3 will be learning about storytelling, elements of writing, and all about our state of Massachusetts as we spend the year exploring and reading the story "Nicholas: A Massachusetts Tale".

Along with checking out some great stories from the library, **Grades 4 and 5**, will be gearing up to evaluate information from many different sources this year and learning how to spot the purpose behind storytelling whether it's fiction or nonfiction.

District Professional Development - Teachers are also continuously learning. At our PD sessions this week, principles, coaches, coordinators, and teachers spent time in grade level teams reflecting on and planning with our content curriculum maps.

WELCOME TO THE MARTHA JONES SCHOOL DIRECTORY

We are excited to share with you that the Martha Jones PTO will continue to use AtoZConnect (also known as Membership Toolkit) as our school directory. We have our own unique website this year at <https://mjspto.membershiptoolkit.com/>

Please register as a NEW USER when logging in for the first time. Don't forget to bookmark the site for quick and easy access. Each year, parents must register for the new school year. **Therefore, the log-in information you used last year will no longer work.**

AtoZConnect is a secure web-based system that allows parents to verify and edit their own directory listings. This will replace the printed directory we have provided in the past. With AtoZConnect you will be able to update your own information if it changes. With the AtoZ Membership Toolkit app, you will also be able to access the directory on the go and always have it at your fingertips.

To ensure we have the most up-to-date information for your family, please [click on this link](#) to register and verify your data. You can also add information such as an email address and a phone number for a second parent who would like to have his/her own access to AtoZConnect. This will only take five minutes of your time. Please note: This needs to be done annually so even if you did it last year, please take the time to re-confirm.

If you have not yet verified and updated your information in the Aspen system this year, you will need to request access to AtoZConnect and it will take up to 24-48 hours until you will have access to the system.

Join the Martha Jones PTO

After you have verified your information on AtoZ, you will also be invited to join the Martha Jones PTO. The cost of a PTO membership is \$45 for families with one child and \$55 for families with two or more children. A PTO membership gives you access to the full Martha Jones directory on AtoZConnect. If you do not sign up for PTO membership, you will not have access to the directory. However, you will still have an AtoZConnect account and the ability to update your information and receive all PTO notices.

Support of the PTO through a PTO membership helps fund events, special projects, and educational programs throughout the year. The PTO Board is already working on ways to convert many of our traditional in-person highlights to social distanced events this year. Now more than ever we want to make sure we provide fun, engaging activities to help our Martha Jones families feel connected.

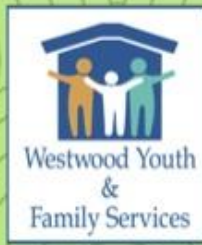
