# Learning About March Holidays: Holi, St. Patrick's Day, St. Joseph's Day

Holi, March 8th - is a Hindu festival that has been celebrated since ancient times. The Holi Festival is celebrated as a way to welcome in spring, and also is seen as a new beginning where people can release all their inhibitions and start fresh. It is said that during the Holi Festival, the gods turn a blind eye, and it's one of the few times extremely devout Hindus allow themselves to let loose. They open up and enjoy each other's company, take time to dance and party, and throw their cultural norms to the side. On the first day of the festival, a bonfire is lit to symbolically burn away all the bad and give way to a colorful and vibrant new future.

St. Patrick's Day, March 17th - commemorates Saint Patrick in Ireland and celebrates the heritage and culture of the Irish in general. Celebrations generally involve public parades and festivals, and the wearing of green attire or shamrocks.

St. Joseph's Day, March 19th - giving food to the needy is a Saint Joseph's Day custom. In some communities it is traditional to wear red clothing and eat a Neapolitan pastry known as a <u>zeppola</u> (zeppole). In some European countries, fathers are honored on this day.





### **Important Preschool News**

Re: Change in Enrollment Practice

Enrollment in the Westwood Integrated Preschool takes place via an annual lottery of interested families. Starting with the enrollment process for the 2023-2024 school year, the District is changing how the lottery is conducted. Specifically, new families who are enrolling in the Preschool for the fall of 2023 will no longer be guaranteed future slots for siblings. (Families who previously enrolled students in the Preschool with the expectation that siblings will be guaranteed a slot will be "grandfathered.") This change in practice reflects feedback we have received from the community and our desire to create more equitable access for all residents we serve. We understand that decisions about preschool involve many factors and want to make sure that families have this information now to assist with future planning.

# New - Information Regarding Lunch

We are noticing some students attempting to share food and drinks with their classmates. This is not safe and when we see this, we intervene to stop it. Lately, some students are bringing in energy drink packets to mix with water and staff has seen students attempting to share them with friends.

Energy drinks can have consequences for some students. There may be dyes in them, and some students have allergies. These drinks typically contain large amounts of caffeine (as much as 3 cups of coffee), added sugars, and other additives which could cause dysregulation among some students. The American Academy of Pediatrics does not recommend these drinks for children. I am not necessarily referring to typical sports drinks, rather those beverages labeled as *energy drinks*. This is concerning.

Please monitor your students' lunches and review with them that they may not share food or drinks with their friends at lunch. Thank you for helping us keep our students safe.

## News from the Health Office

As we approach the Winter months, please review these tips for staying healthy and promoting health in the MJ community.

- · Stay up to date with Flu and Covid vaccines
- Practice good hand-washing and personal hygiene, including wearing masks when indicated
- Staying home when you are sick. Children need to remain home until they are no longer contagious. This limits the spread of illness and allows the child to recover more quickly.

Please see a helpful comparison chart of the different symptoms for RSV, Flu, Covid-19 and the common cold below.

# News from 5G (Ms. Gross)

In fifth grade science, students learn about physical changes of matter. As an exciting way to preview the upcoming physical matter unit, we had a special presentation by a scientist from the Discovery Museum. She taught vocabulary words such as matter, gas, liquid, solid, melting, freezing, evaporation, condensation, and sublimation. She demonstrated the transitions of water from solid to liquid to gas. The highlights of her presentation were the dry ice and liquid nitrogen! Students were able to pour and hold the evaporated dry ice as it reached its **sublimation** point. We watched as she froze and shattered a carnation and banana after dipping them into liquid nitrogen, and heard a hammer constrict as it made contact with the freezing items. We had the best time learning about the physical changes of matter!
