Principal's Message

MJ Community,

Over the next couple of weeks the classroom teachers, special education teachers, specialists, school psychologist, and I will begin the process of determining class placement for September 2024. During the placement process, it is important for us to consider all relevant information. We review information about each child's academic, social, and personal characteristics and use that information when making placement decisions. Our primary goal is to assign each child to a classroom in which they can develop academically and socially.

If you have information about your child's learning needs that you would like to share, please send me your input via email (<u>mkuklentz@westwood.k12.ma.us</u>) by Monday, April 29, 2024. Although you may have had a discussion with your child's teacher or Ms. MaryKate Stimpson during the spring conference about class placement, all requests must be sent to me. Parent letters received will be compiled into a document separate from final lists and distributed to the placement team members for consideration. Please note that letters and emails are not kept from previous years since children change and grow, and we make decisions based on current information.

If you are the parent of multiples (twins, triplets, etc), you may specify whether you want your children placed in the same class or different classes. Also, please know that if you have more

than one child in your family, there is a chance that they will not have the same teachers as their siblings.

Westwood Public Schools does not allow parents to request their children's teachers; therefore, requests for specific teachers will not be accepted or considered. The placement process is both thoughtful and thorough as teachers do their best to balance classes and social dynamics. As Principal, I approve the final placement decision. The staff and I appreciate your cooperation and support as we begin this process.

Finally, there is no requirement to submit a placement letter.

Spring Allergies

Allergies are caused by the body's reaction to substances called "allergens," which trigger the immune system to react to harmless substances as though they were attacking the body.

Allergic rhinitis is an inflammation of the nasal membranes and eyes caused by certain particles in our environment (like, pollen and molds, or dust mites and animal dander).

The symptoms of allergic rhinitis

- Runny nose
- Sneezing
- Itchiness of the eyes, nose and throat
- Headache and fatigue can be symptoms sometimes
- How can you minimize exposure to seasonal allergy triggers?
 - Wash hands and face when coming inside come from playing outside so pollen is not rubbed in eyes and nose
 - Take a shower at night before bedtime to wash off any pollen
 - Do not bring items from outside into the bedroom
 - Keep windows in your home and car closed when possible
 - Check the forecast for pollen levels, and limit outdoor activities when pollen counts are higher

Time for Tick Checks:

Everyone living in the New England area where ticks are common should perform nightly tick checks during the warm months. Rapid discovery and removal prevents ticks from transmitting diseases. Keep in mind that ticks are very small and love to be in warm dark places like the armpit, groin, around the ear and on the back of the neck.

Bike safety:

Wearing a helmet is one of the most important ways to stay safe on a bike! Bike riding is a great way for families to get some outdoor exercise; however, it's also a leading cause of injuries in children.

News from the MJ Classroom's News from 5B (Mr. Bartlett)



The last few weeks of 5th grade have been out of this world!

A few weeks ago we started a thematic unit about space travel and exploration which culminated with a field trip to the Christa McAulife Challenger Learning Center at Framingham State University. While there, we acted like college freshmen and visited a planetarium and took part in a simulated Mars mission. In the planetarium, we looked at the stars and planets in the night sky and were able to zoom in to see constellations and nebulae that would only otherwise be visible with a powerful telescope. Students also got to search for distant planets in the 'Goldilocks' zones of other stars

in the search for possible life. During our simulated Mars mission, students all took on a different STEM role as part of the mission and worked together to land a manned mission from the Martian moon Phobos to Mars itself. A week later, Dr Mike from the Top Secret Science program came to visit both 5th grade classes at Martha Jones and worked with students to create a stargazer craft that maps the night sky at different times of the year. And of course, this last week was the solar eclipse where 5th grade students mapped the path of the moon as it covered the sun using the solar glasses given to each student.

News from 4W (Mrs. Waldner)



Fourth grade is reviewing key vocabulary within our measurement and geometry unit. Students are playing a Heads-up or Scattergories-like activity where they describe the word to their partner and they have to guess the vocabulary word posted behind them. This develops their math vocabulary, word retrieval, and quick recall. It's a fun way to start the day within our morning meetings and review challenging vocabulary. Today the words were congruent, symmetry, centimeter, yard, hexagon, and pentagon. Feel free to play with a loved one at home!

News from Music (Mrs. Pickering)



The Martha Jones 4th grade musicians have been focusing on **Instrument Exploration**. The students are understanding that musical instruments can express the mood of a story, represent a character, or be used for sound effects.



Each class worked with a partner or small group to create

percussion accompaniment for an assigned page of the book, <u>Giving Thanks: A Native American</u> <u>Good Morning Message</u> by Chief Jake Swamp. The students instrumental accompaniment included a melodic ostinato pattern and sound effect.


