

### Principals Message

MJ Community,

I often say this, but I truly love my job and feel fortunate to work at Martha Jones. This sentiment was reaffirmed on Thursday. As I prepared to write this message, I found myself procrastinating by walking around the building—a habit that often reminds me why I love being here.



The start of each day at our school is marked by morning meetings in every classroom. These gatherings set a positive and welcoming tone, helping students prepare socially and academically for the day ahead. During my walk, I was continually struck by the skill, flexibility, and intentionality our teachers bring to their classrooms.

Each morning meeting I visited was engaging and effective, but what stood out to me was the remarkable range of experiences across the different grade levels in our building. In a Kindergarten classroom, for instance, a student proudly took on their "classroom job" of announcing what day it was yesterday, today, and tomorrow. As they read aloud, it became clear that another student had forgotten to update the days on the chart, which still reflected Wednesday. The teacher gently allowed the moment to unfold, asking the class if anyone noticed anything unusual. The student

who had forgotten quickly realized the mistake, corrected it, and moved on. It was a wonderful example of how our students are encouraged to embrace mistakes and recognize the interconnectedness of their roles.

In a fifth-grade classroom, I joined a morning meeting where students were sharing their shoe sizes. The teacher cleverly used this casual conversation to segue into an introduction to graphing fractions, a concept they would delve into later that day. In just five minutes, I witnessed students practicing mathematical habits of mind that will serve them well as they move on to middle and high school.

The thoughtfulness our teachers bring to their work is evident everywhere I look. Their ability to build meaningful connections with students and seize teachable moments is truly inspiring. As a community, we are incredibly fortunate to have such dedicated and skilled professionals shaping our children's learning experiences.

also use SDM if your child will be late, absent, or is being dismissed early. TY


### **Lost and Found**

### News from the MJ Classroom's News from 4B (Ms. Bass)





In fourth grade, students have been learning to multiply larger number sets using a range of strategies. One common method involves finding partial products and adding them together. Another strategy, called "doubling and halving," is often solved mentally. For example, instead of solving  $24 \times 4$  directly, the expression can be adjusted to  $12 \times 8$ , which is easier to compute. As shown in the pictures, students frequently work in pairs to solve multiplication word problems and check each other's work for accuracy.

### **FAMILY BINGO NIGHT**



### Westwood Youth and Family Services


