MATH LEAGUE

Math League is a before school, parent run opportunity for students in 2nd to 5th grade to have fun with math. Students come together every two weeks at a grade level to engage in fun math problems with their peers and it culminates in a Math League competition against the other WPS elementary schools in the Spring. Math League registration opened on October 8th. Here is more information:

Join Math League at MJS!

Who:

- · Math League is open to 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th graders of all math abilities!!
- · In order for the program to run, **parent/guardian volunteers** are needed. We ask that parents/guardians sign-up to volunteer for at least **3 sessions**.
- \cdot Please let us know if this is not possible for your family, and we will do our best to accommodate. Parents/guardians must have an active CORI to volunteer.

What:

· Students meet before school and practice solving math problems in teams. Although the types of problems are often new, children learn how to tackle them by applying the skills they have already

learned in school.

- The goal is to **make math fun and accessible** by showing kids they have the ability to successfully take on new math challenges.
- · There is no cost to participate in MJ Math League.

When & Where:

- · Math League will meet roughly every other Friday morning before school at Martha Jones School from 7:50-8:40 AM.
- · Math league begins **November 7, 2025 and runs through late March-early April, 2026**. In the Spring, each grade will compete in a **Math Meet** against the other Westwood elementary schools.

Why:

- · It's fun!! Kids enjoy working with their friends and develop both curiosity and confidence.
- · Math League is a good opportunity for students with strong math skills to try something new and for students who find math a challenge to work in a fun setting.

Martha Jones MCAS results found that we are meeting and exceeding targets and are in the 99th percentile for accountability and performed very well across 3rd, 4th, and 5th grades in ELA, Math, and Science.



Dismissal Changes (SDM: Extended Day & MiniCourses)

MJ PTO Fall MiniCourses are well underway. TY to all who have embraced the technology and updated your child's dismissal



routine. Also, some families have changed their child's enrollment status for Extended Day. As a reminder...

For dismissals directly to MiniCourses:

You can set up all dates automatically by using the "Recurring Dismissal" feature. Follow these directions:

- 1. Click on Recurring Dismissal
- 2. Select student name
- 3. Select "Mini Courses" under Dismissal Instructions and add the Mini Course name in the "notes" field
- 4. Select your mini course day(s)
- 5. Apply to: Every Week
- 6. Include the Start Date & End Date

For dismissals to MiniCourses from Extended Day:

Please note if your child is going to MiniCourse from Extended Day the Release Form for Extended Day needs to be completed and the only dismissal note in SDM should be EXTENDED DAY. If your child is **not** returning to Extended Day at the end of a MiniCourse you must change the dismissal instruction in SDM to reflect MINI COURSE (as listed in the "dismissals directly to MiniCourse" instruction)

For updated default dismissals (to/from Extended Day to other options)

Please feel free to update your child's default dismissal directly for the days that might change due to added or dropped enrollment in Extended Day.

Please understand we are all striving for student safety, delineating a clear chain of custody for your child.

All children will be dismissed per the parent instruction in SDM.

More Dismissal Questions - MJ Buses

It is District policy that children do NOT switch buses. All bus numbers are listed in SDM so parents can select the appropriate bus for their child but switching buses is still not allowed. Can children be dropped off at a different stop on the way home?

<u>Students may only ride their assigned buses.</u> Transporting students to an alternative, yet existing, stop on the student's same route may be granted if done so on a regular basis (example: three days per week). Requests for alternative stops should be made in writing to Scherie Ciarrocchi, Bus Coordinator (<u>sciarrocchi@westwood.k12.ma.us</u>) and sent to Westwood Public Schools, 220 Nahatan Street, Westwood, MA 02090. Transporting students for play dates, lessons, or other reasons is not permitted.
