Principal's Message

It sure feels like Fall is here, the frost to start the morning and the leaves are changing. While the weather turns cooler, the learning continues to heat up here at MJ. I wanted to highlight the images below. In the first activity, Kindergarteners and 3rd graders are partnering up. Each pair creates a monster together, with the Kindergartener leading the design. The 3rd grader then uses the artwork as inspiration for a descriptive paragraph. The final two pictures are of our developing musicians. Our 4th graders were learning how to use the parts of their flute with Mrs. Labedz and our 5th grade Band was rehearsing for their winter concert.

This week also kicks off our Fall parent-teacher conferences. These meetings are a great opportunity to discuss your child's transition into the school year and the progress they've made so far.

CORI Forms

Thank you to all our wonderful MJ Community Members for volunteering. Please note all volunteers **must** have a completed CORI background check before volunteering or chaperoning of any kind. People who have completed a CORI through another town department (ex. Parks & Rec) <u>must still</u> complete a CORI for the School Department.

WPS is implimenting an updated CORI policy whereas <u>all volunteers</u> <u>must complete a CORI annually</u>. If you did **not** complete a new form

when school started in September you WILL BE REQUIRED to complete a new form starting in the next calendar year (from January.)

Also note the CORI Form submission is not considered complete until it is also accompanied with a copy of your current picture ID (License or Passport).

Happy Crafting From 2H

Crafting with second graders offers a wide range of developmental and emotional benefits. It encourages creativity and self-expression, allowing the children to explore their imagination and develop confidence in their ideas. Fine motor skills are strengthened as children cut, glue, paint, and manipulate small objects, helping improve hand-eye coordination and dexterity. Crafting supports cognitive growth by introducing concepts like colors, shapes, and patterns, and it

nurtures problem-solving as kiddos figure out how to bring their ideas to life. In 2H crafting together fosters communication, patience, and collaboration, strengthening the bond between the children in class. Most importantly, it provides a joyful, hands-on way for children to learn and create lasting memories.

In the Learning Center, fourth graders are practicing how to use context clues to determine character traits. They are analyzing a character's words and actions to identify traits that best describe them. Students then locate evidence to support each trait and complete an organizer by "lifting a line" from the text as well as restating evidence in their own words.
