Principal's Message

MJ,

My annual winter newsletter information seems needed earlier than usual this year! While there is no snow in our forecast, the flurries this week seemed a harbringer of winter. As we enter the winter months (and hopefully some snow). I wanted to remind our community that students go outside, even in snowy weather, unless it is an unsafe temperature. Students will also not have outside recess if the conditions are too icy or rainy. Please make sure your children are dressed for the winter temperatures, so they can play outside comfortably and safely.

On snowy days, please make sure your children are equipped with snow pants and snow boots. Without this gear, students will need to play on the shoveled blacktop areas of the playground, which is a lot less fun than playing in the snow on the field or playground. Please send your children to school with a pair of shoes in addition to snow boots. It is also helpful to send an extra pair of shoes with your children on and after rainy days. This will help students stay comfortable and keep our hallways and classrooms clean and dry throughout the day.

Finally, please label all of your students outwear: jackets, boots, gloves and hats. It makes finding the owner much easier.

Parent Read Aloud

Dear Families.

Last year, the Office of Student Services began developing a new Parent Read Aloud program, designed to provide an opportunity to increase parent/caregiver involvement specifically in Elementary classrooms across the district. The goal of the program is to expose all students to various types of disabilities across grade levels. This fall, Donna Tobin, Director of Social-Emotional Learning, formed a committee of parents and educators. The group, under the leadership of Donna Tobin, reviewed and selected books as well as developed a parent/caregiver training for the program. Parents/caregivers were excited about supporting this program last year, and we hope that we can count on you again this year.

We have Parent Coordinators from each of the elementary schools: Samantha Sturma, Downey School; Jennifer Kaddy, Martha Jones School; Mercedes Carrasco, Pine Hill School, and Shelagh Danaher, Sheehan School, along with Meg Kara, Pine Hill librarian; and Abby Smith, Sheehan School Psychologist partnering with Dr. Tobin to review, evaluate, and select books and conversation prompts, and locate simple activities to go along with some of the books. We have selected books that represent a wide range of topics, including: neurodiversity, intellectual disabilities, and

physical/health disabilities. We hope these books will support our goal of celebrating individual differences and allow all students to see themselves and others as wonderfully unique individuals.

How You Can Help!

We are looking for parent/caregiver volunteer readers from each grade level (kindergarten through grade 5) at your child's school. The role would include:

- Attending a 30-minute training that will help you prepare for class discussions, questions, and feedback.
- Preview and select the book from your grade level list/bin
- Work with the classroom teachers to select a time each month from January through May to go into each grade level classroom to read the books. (Note: each read-aloud story comes with guiding questions for a whole-class discussion)
- Provide feedback at the end of the year to your school's Parent Coordinator on what worked well and what might be adjusted in future years to improve the program.

If you can help by becoming a volunteer Reader, <u>please complete this sign up form no later than November 21, 2025</u>. If you would like more information about volunteering before signing up, please reach out to your **School Coordinator above** or contact Donna Tobin. Once we have our volunteers, we will reach out with training dates (flexible) and next steps. Please make sure you have an updated CORI on file. A CORI is required for all volunteers. You can check with your school's administrative assistant to complete a CORI or check your current status.

CORI Forms

Thank you to all our wonderful MJ Community Members for volunteering. Please note all volunteers **must** have a completed CORI background check before volunteering or chaperoning of any kind. People who have completed a CORI through another town department (ex. Parks & Rec) <u>must still</u> complete a CORI for the School Department.

WPS is implimenting an updated CORI policy whereas <u>all volunteers</u> <u>must complete a CORI annually</u>. If you did **not** complete a new form

when school started in September you WILL BE REQUIRED to complete a new form starting in the next calendar year (from January.)

Also note the CORI Form submission is not considered complete until it is also accompanied with a copy of your current picture ID (License or Passport).
