Principal's Message

This is just a quick reminder to please be sure to update SDM should you have any changes to your child(s) normal or default attendance or dismissal preferences. For the change to take effect in the system it should be made before 11:00AM.

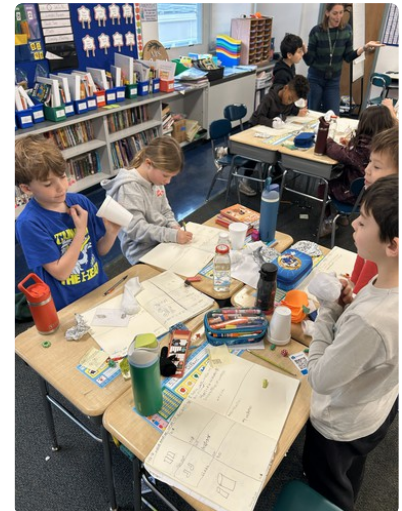

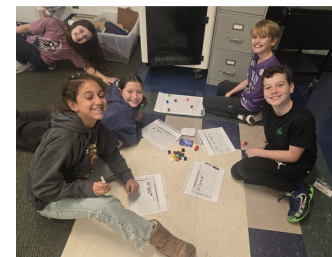
News from 2P (Mrs. Perry)



How do we keep things warm or cold? Our second-grade scientists are finding out! With Ms. Goosen this week, we explored the properties of insulation and conduction. Through hands-on testing with aluminum foil, cloth (socks), and styrofoam cups, students compared how different materials handle heat. They then used this information to determine which material would make the best insulator. This ties into our current unit, which is focusing on the properties of different materials.



News from 5P (Mr. Parkhurst)



Students in Mr. Parkhurst's class are wrapping up a math unit on adding and subtracting fractions. As part of this unit students play a lot of games such as Fraction Track. Fraction Track is a math game where students advance on a number line by adding fractions, reinforcing how fractions relate to one another and to whole numbers. The game supports visual understanding of fraction equivalence, magnitude, and fraction addition.



News from Mrs. Crimmings

The Story Grammar Marker is a visual tool we use to help children understand, tell, and write stories in a clear and organized way. Many children struggle to know what to include in a story and in what order. This visual gives them a concrete roadmap to follow.

Each symbol represents an important part of a story:

- Character – Who the story is about
- Setting – Where and when the story takes place
- Initiating Event – What problem or event starts the story

- Character
- Setting
- Kick-Off
- Internal Response
- Plan
- Attempts or Actions
- Direct Consequence
- Resolution

- Retell stories more completely
- Organize their thoughts before speaking or writing
- Improve story comprehension and memory
- Build stronger narrative and writing skills

- “Who was the story about?”
- “What went wrong?”
- “What did the character do to fix it?”
- “How did it end?”
